Amateur Radio Week in LA

Governor Jeff Landry has proclaimed June 22nd -29th as “Amateur Radio Week in Louisiana.” The proclamation recognizes the hard work of volunteers in times of disasters to all the emergency management organizations including GOHSEP. It also recognizes amateur radio’s contributions to STEM, and the annual Field Day coming up on June 28-29.

LA House Bill 851 Enacted

Representative John Illg recycled House Bill 851 from the last session. The Bill passed the House and Senate and will become law on August 1st without the Governor’s signature. The Bill will become Act 196 when it becomes law in August. The same bill passed last session but was vetoed by Governor Jeff Landry because he claimed the bill was “unenforceable.” The bill easily passed both bodies this session. It prohibits the release of mylar and latex balloons because of environmental concerns and issues when balloons become entangled in power lines. Last year Houston Polson, N5YS, Louisiana ARRL Section Manager was able to lobby the committee and had an exception added for amateur radio pico balloons. There are several other exemptions listed in the Bill as well

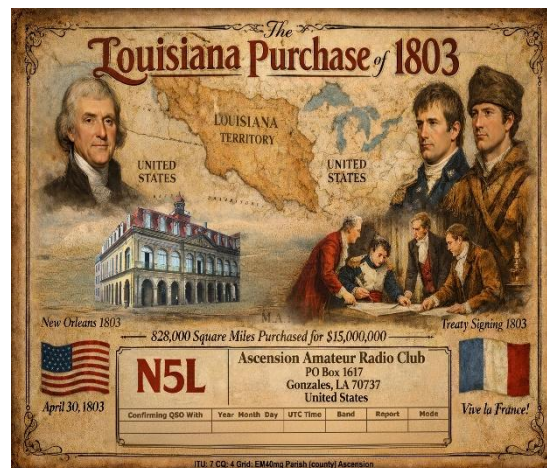

BRARC hosted a hybrid General class in May and will hold a VE test session June 6th at the Goodwood location of the East Baton Rouge Parish Library.

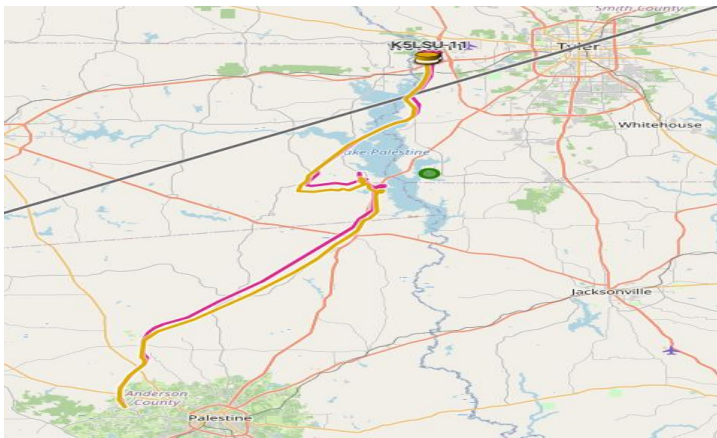

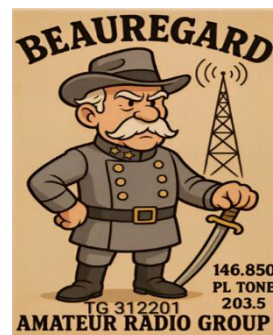

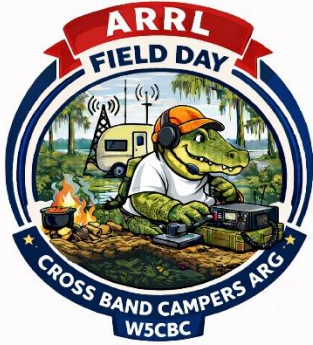

Cross Band Campers ARG

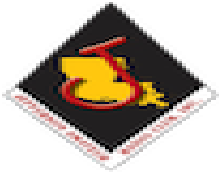

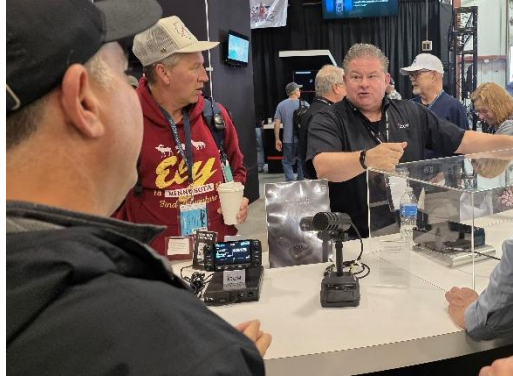
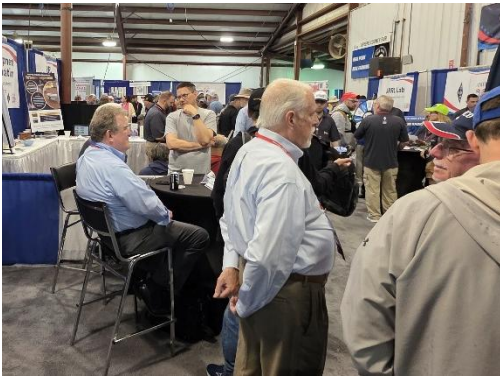
APRS is currently active on 145.825 MHz as additional testing takes place on the Service Module packet radio.

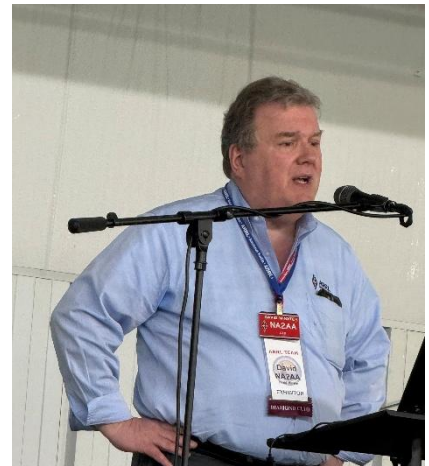




ARRL Leadership at Hamvention

Some of the presenters at the ARRL Forum in Xenia were Rick Roderick, K5UR, ARRL President (pictured left). Rick went over the structure of the ARRL leadership and Board of Directors and how minutes of Board meetings are much more detailed than previous years. He also emphasized reasons to be an ARRL member and for members to take a more active part or leadership role in the local clubs.

David Minister, NA2AA, ARRL CEO also spoke to membership. He said the letter writing campaign was second only to the One Big Beautiful Bill and had over 150,000 letters sent in. David spoke about how the ARRL has been lobbying Congress the last 10 years trying to get legislation passed to allow hams in HOA's to have antennas. ARRL leadership realizes that the odds of getting either of the 2 bill through a dysfunctional Congress are slim and efforts will have to start over in the next Congress. He said a new tact may be to attach legislation to the National 9-1-1 Bill. Speaking personally with David afterwards, he mention to this writer that there are also some other plans in the works to get Congress' attention. He spoke about the Spectrum Defense and IARU efforts to preserve amateur bands. Traders are using high power, high speed digital modes for stock trading and are threatening Amateur HF. David mentioned there are no hams on the FCC Board of Directors and how cellular and satellite companies are looking for more bandwidth which could jeopardize UHF amateur bands

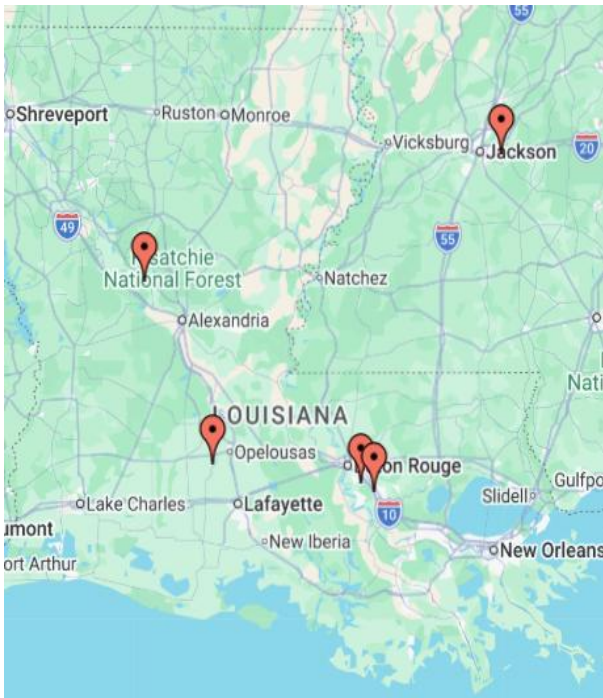

Sen Ted Cruz on Behalf of Amateur Radio

From ARRL:

Senator Ted Cruz, [in a strong pre-Memorial Day message](#) publicly highlighted the critical role that Amateur Radio Service volunteers play during disasters, praising and thanking ham radio operators who provide essential communications when storms and emergencies knock out power and cellular networks and communities are cut off. Sen. Cruz observed that in these emergencies it is ham radio operators who step forward, bringing with them the tools, expertise, and the commitment to reconnect people when it matters most. He noted this dedication was clearly demonstrated in 2017 when Hurricane Harvey's catastrophic flooding devastated communities across Texas and that it was demonstrated again more recently in the horrific Camp Mystic floods. He emphasized that as the Nation prepares for yet another summer storm season, ham radio's role remains just as vital as ever. Stating that while future emergencies will come, Sen. Cruz pointed out that so would Amateur Radio — ready to respond, ready to serve, and to make a difference. He ended his statements, thanking ham radio for its courage and commitment, noting that Amateur Radio's work strengthens our communities.



Senator Cruz is Chairman of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. His comments align with the ARRL's ongoing efforts to strengthen and protect Amateur Radio's role in emergency preparedness and public service communications.



CHU Going QRT

As of June 22, 2026, the shortwave broadcast of the official time signal of the NCRC will no longer be available. The three frequencies were used 3.330, 7.850, and 14.670 MHz SSB These frequencies came from one of the three atomic clocks in the emitting station. Each frequency used its own antenna provided an hourly signal without the need to use a single-side band radio. Station identification is very easy: the announcements were made by a talking clock using digitally recorded voice. voice. The voice in French was that of Simon Durivage (from Radio-Canada) and the voice in English is that of Harry Mannis (former CBC host). CHU Station is located 15km (10 miles) SW of Ottawa. It was the property of the National Research Council of Canada (CNRC).
