Cheryl Burgess, MD

Dr. Burgess is the founder, medical director, and president of the Center for Dermatology and Dermatologic Surgery, PC in Washington, DC. She is an Assistant Clinical Professor at Georgetown University and The George Washington University located in the District of Columbia. Dr. Burgess earned her doctorate of medicine degree from Howard University College of Medicine in 1984, completed a residency in dermatology and became a Fellow of the American Board of Dermatology in 1988. She is an active member of the American Academy of Dermatology, American Society for Dermatologic Surgery, American Dermatological Association, Womens Dermatologic Society, Dermatology Foundation, Alpha Omega Alpha, Medical Society of the District of Columbia, the District of Columbia Dermatological Society and former Board of Directors for the American Society of Dermatologic Surgery, Women's Dermatologic Society, DASIL and the Skin of Color Society. She is currently on the Board of Directors for the American Academy of Dermatology.



Kiyanna Williams, MD

Dr. Williams is Section Head of the Skin of Color Section and Staff Physician in the Section of Micrographic Surgery (Mohs) and Cutaneous Oncology in the Department of Dermatology at Cleveland Clinic.

Dr. Williams received a Bachelor of Science degree in Human Physiology graduating magna cum laude from Boston University and received her medical degree from University of California, San Francisco. Dr. Williams completed a transitional internship at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, MI and a residency in dermatology at University of Michigan, followed by a fellowship in Micrographic Surgery (Mohs) and Cutaneous Oncology at Cleveland Clinic. Dr. Williams is a fellow of the American Board of Dermatology and the American College of Mohs Surgery.

Her special interests include Mohs micrographic surgery, skin of color and cosmetic dermatology. Dr. Williams has been involved extensively in medical education, mentorship and diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives.



Brooke Jackson, MD

Dr. Brooke Jackson is a board certified dermatologist and dermatologic surgeon, best selling author, 10 -time marathoner, healthy skin advocate and owner of Skin Wellness Dermatology Associates in Durham, NC.

After completing two fellowships, Laser Surgery at Harvard and a second in Mohs surgery, she founded the Mohs Surgery Unit at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston. She then moved to Chicago, where she founded the Skin Wellness Center of Chicago and held a clinical faculty position in the Department of Dermatology at Northwestern University. In 2013, Dr. Jackson relocated to the Triangle area of North Carolina. She was an Associate Professor of Dermatology at UNC, Chapel Hill until opening her private practice Skin Wellness Dermatology Associates, PA. Dr. Jackson's practice philosophy focuses on patient education and skin wellness.

Dr. Jackson is a frequent and sought after guest and resource for national and local media on dermatology concerns. In 2022, she was featured in a national commercial for DOVE. An avid runner and budding triathlete, Dr. Jackson has completed 10 marathons (26.2 miles). She is married with three very active children and has written two books: Child of Mine: Caring for the skin and hair of your adopted child which was published in 2012 and, most recently, Skincare for Runners in 2021, a #1 amazon new release best seller. She has developed a product line JOYLA for the everyday athlete.

Ginette Okoye, MD

Dr. Okoye is Professor and Chair of Dermatology at Howard University College of Medicine. Her areas of clinical and research expertise are in cutaneous disorders that disproportionately affect people with pigmented skin, including hidradenitis suppurativa, cutaneous T-cell lymphoma, and health disparities in dermatology. She earned her Medical Degree from Columbia University College of Physicians & Surgeons and completed her dermatology training at Yale University, where she also served as Chief Resident.

Dr. Okoye has been recognized by the American Academy of Dermatology with a Presidential Citation, a Volunteerism Award, and the 2021 Patient Care Hero Award, as well as multiple student and resident teaching awards. She has been the recipient of research grants from the Skin of Color Society and the Dermatology Foundation.

Dr. Okoye is the immediate past Chair of the dermatology Section of the National Medical Association and Co-Chair of the Scientific Committee of the Skin of Color Society. She serves as an Associate Editor for the Journal of Investigative Dermatology Innovations, and on the Editorial Boards of the Journal of the National Medical Association and the British Journal of Dermatology. During the COVID19 pandemic, Dr. Okoye served as the Medical Lead for Howard University's COVID19 Community Testing Initiative and the Medical Director of Howard University's Employee COVID19 testing clinic.



Valerie Callender, MD

Dr. Callender is a Board-Certified Dermatologist who is known for her sensitive and cutting-edge approach to the management of hair loss in women and the treatment of pigmentation disorders. Dr. Callender has performed leadership roles in many dermatological organizations, including the Women's Dermatologic Society and the Skin of Color Society, which she is Past President of both societies, and has served on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee of the American Academy of Dermatology. She is the current President-Elect of the American Academy of Dermatologic Association. She is the Founder and Medical Director of the Callender Dermatology & Cosmetic Center and Founder and Principal Investigator for Callender Center for Clinical Research, which is in the Washington, DC metropolitan region.

Dr. Callender received her medical degree from Howard University, where she also did her residency and currently serves as Professor of Dermatology at the College of Medicine. She is the recipient of the Women's Dermatologic President's Award and Mentor of the Year Award, and the Dermatology Foundation's Clark W. Finnerud Award. The Clark W. Finnerud Award is given each year to an individual who has devoted extraordinary time and talent as a part-time teacher and clinician.



Ron Feldman, MD

Dr. Feldman is currently an Associate Professor of Dermatology at Emory University in Atlanta, GA. He has a subspecialty interest in Autoimmune Blistering Diseases (AIBD). This interest began as a dermatology resident at Cleveland Clinic and continued through his fellowship in Boston at the Center for Blistering Diseases. He has been the Director of the AIBD Clinic for the past 10 years and now manages many patients from all over the Southeast United States with various blistering diseases including pemphigus and pemphigoid.

Dr. Feldman conducts an active translational research program which includes ongoing clinical trials and collaborative efforts for biomarker analyses for advancement of novel and more targeted therapies. He has received numerous awards including the Junior Researcher Award and Hidden Gem Awards from Emory University. His research has been funded by the National Institutes of Health, Dermatology Foundation, International Pemphigus Pemphigoid Foundation, and Industry sponsors.

Tiffany Clay, MD, FAAD

Dr. Clay is a board-certified dermatologist serving the Atlanta metropolitan area. She graduated magna cum laude from Dillard University in 2006 and subsequently earned her medical doctorate at Meharry Medical College where she became a member of AOA. She completed her dermatology residency at Saint Louis University where she served as chief resident.

Dr. Clay has been practicing medical, surgical and cosmetic dermatology with Dermatology Affiliates since 2015. Her special interests include skin of color, injectable fillers and neuromodulators as well as skin cancer detection and prevention. She is board certified by the American Board of Dermatology. Howa Yeung, MD

Dr. Yeung is an Assistant Professor of Dermatology at Emory University School of Medicine. He earned his MD from New York University, trained at Emory for dermatology residency, and completed a Master of Science in Clinical Research at Emory. His clinical practice focuses on caring for underserved patients living with HIV/AIDS and sexual and gender minority populations. His NIH-funded research program aims to improve prevention and outcomes of skin diseases that disproportionately affect sexual and gender minority populations, such as hormonal skin disorders in transgender persons.



Rawan Bosley, MD

Dr. Bosley is board certified by the American Board of Dermatology. He graduated Magna Cum Laude from Howard University and received his Doctor of Medicine from the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine. He completed residency in Dermatology at Wayne State University where he served as the Chief Resident. Dr. Bosley is an ASDS fellowship trained Dermatologic Surgeon completing his fellowship in Micrographic, Reconstructive and Cosmetic dermatologic surgery at the Chesnut Institute of Cosmetic and Reconstructive Surgery in Spokane, Wa

Dr. Bosley has authored several journal articles and textbook chapters across the fields of dermatology and facial plastic surgery. He is an associate professor of clinical studies at Texas Christian University College of Medicine. He is a member of the American Academy of Dermatology, American Society for Dermatologic Surgery, National Medical Association and the Texas Medical Association.



Candrice Heath MD

Dr. Heath is an Assistant Professor of Dermatology, clinical researcher and Director of Pediatric Dermatology at the Lewis Katz School of Medicine, Temple University. Chesahna Kindred, MD MBA

Chesahna Kindred, MD, MBA, FAAD is a board-certified dermatologist practicing in Columbia, MD. As a pre-med student co-founded the MAPS chapter at the University of Southern California. She was the 3rd person in the history of University of Cincinnati to earn a dual MD/MBA degree. After a dermatology research fellowship at Howard University, she completed dermatology residency at the same institution.
