Covid-19 Safety Requirements Boston.gov/CityConstruction

City of Boston Goal: For the health & Safety of workers, their families and our communities. Applicable to emergency construction now and all construction when it restarts. All must adhere to Covid-19 best practices during this public health emergency.

New Requirements:

To achieve this goal, there will be two new requirements for all permitted construction jobs:

- 1. <u>Covid-19 Safety Plan</u>: Every contractor will be required to provide the City this document when applying for a permit. If a job is already permitted, contractors must provide by April 25th or before work starts.
- 2. <u>Covid-19 Safety Affidavit</u>: Every contractor will be required to provide the City this document when applying for a permit. If a job is already permitted, contractors must provide by April 25th or before work starts.

<u>Safety Plan Worksheet</u>: This is a sample document of CDC, State and industry best practices for Covid-19 safety plans. It's meant to help contractors draft their plans. It doesn't need to be provided to the City.

Six Key Elements of a Covid-19 Safety Plan

- 1. <u>Steps taken before shifts start to ensure workers are healthy</u>. This includes screening for symptom, managing delivers, and having protocols for how your team travels to and from the job site.
- 2. <u>Practices to ensure social distancing can be achieved on the job site</u>. Examples include open air jobs, safety meetings and having spacing and capacity protocols for the use of elevators.
- 3. <u>Materials provided to ensure job site hygiene</u>. Includes access to hot water, hand sanitizer stations, sufficient clean restrooms, and good trash management protocols.
- 4. <u>Protocols for the use of PPE</u>. Workers have gloves, masks, face shields and other PPE they may require.
- 5. <u>Communications and training practices to ensure everyone is informed</u>. Includes job safety meeting specific to ovid-19 and appropriate signage placed throughout the site.
- 6. Procedures in case there is Covid-19 on the job site. Includes protocols regarding notification, cleaning, quarantining, tracing, and returning to work
