Prof Nick Linker BSc MD FRCP ECDS FESC FACC FHRS, is a Consultant Cardiologist at the James Cook University Hospital, Middlesbrough. He trained in Manchester and St George's Hospital, London and was appointed Consultant Cardiologist with an interest in cardiac electrophysiology in 1998. His practice is currently focused on arrhythmia and syncope management plus cardiac implantable electronic devices.

He has extensive experience in teaching and has developed an MSc in cardiac care with the University of Teesside.

He represents NHS North on the Cardiac Services Clinical Reference Group for Specialised Commissioning. He undertakes a number of other roles for NHS England, NHS Digital, NHS Improvement, MHRA and NICE. He was Clinical Lead for the left atrial appendage occlusion Commissioning through Evaluation programme.

Prof Linker was President of the British Heart Rhythm Society from 2014 – 2017.
