GETTING TO THE HEART OF THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Our entire high holiday season is filled with beautiful symbolism. Whether it is eating apples and honey on Rosh Hashanah, hearing the shofar, dressing in white on Yom Kippur, or building a sukkah on Sukkot – for many, the traditions of any given holy day become a profound spiritual and emotional spark for us. Those sparks become the heart – the sacred center – of how we celebrate these holy days.

Commentators have long suggested that the heart of Sukkot can be symbolically paralleled to the etrog. An etrog is similar in size and shape to a human heart, and midrash suggests the heart is the center of wisdom. In Pirkei Avot – The Ethics of Our Fathers – Rabban Yochanan ben Zakkai challenged five of his disciples to (2:13) “go out and discern which is the proper path for a person to follow.” In other words, find those character traits and virtues that we should strive to achieve so that we will become better people and perform more mitzvot. As expected, his five students brought him five different answers. Rabbi Eliezer suggested that one should have a good eye so that one will always see the need to be charitable. Rabbi Yehoshua thought one should be a good friend so that one will always offer constructive criticism. Rabbi Yosi proposed being a good neighbor so that our behaviors will always be forthright. Rabbi Shimon said that everyone should be thoughtful decision makers so that our choices will always help to make the world a better place. And finally, Rabbi Elazar responded that above all else, one should have a good heart so that everything we do is done with kindness,

compassion, wisdom, and understanding. According to Rabban Yochanan ben Zakkai, a person with a good heart encompasses all of the other suggested virtues, so that is the path that everyone should strive to follow.

On Sukkot, we recite hoshanot – pleas to God asking for Divine help. As we do this, we hold our lulavim

and etrogim and walk around the perimeter of the sanctuary, encircling one Torah. Oftentimes as we do this, we hold our etrogim next to our hearts as our eyes are fixed on the Torah and our ears hear our voices joining in communal prayer. Perhaps this is an authentic way to follow the teaching of Rabban Yochanan ben Zakkai. As Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsch said, “The heart is the wellspring of every emotion, every aspiration, every endeavor. It is the source of every moral and spiritual impulse, even of all thought and character. If the heart is ‘good,’ the entire person will be guided by the rule of the good.”

May our hearts be open to goodness and kindness throughout our entire holiday season and beyond. May we be inspired to open our hearts more to the needs of our families, congregation, and greater community. And may our hearts be blessed in the coming year so that we are inscribed and sealed in the Book of Life for a happy, healthy, peaceful, and prosperous New Year.

President's Message

Things are in full swing at Congregation Beth Judea. I hope you were able to participate in the vast array of events during September. I am going to highlight a couple which stood out to me.

We were so fortunate to have Congressman Sean Casten speak to us on September 13 about his recent trip to Israel. This event and Congressman Casten's and the rest of the freshman Congressional class' trip were sponsored by AIPAC. The Congressman discussed his experiences in Israel, and AIPAC informed us about their efforts regarding the AIPAC mission, which is to strengthen, protect, and promote the US-Israel relationship in ways that enhance the security of the United States and Israel. The AIPAC policy conference is going to occur from March 1-3, 2020 in Washington, DC. Last year, 26 members of Congregation Beth Judea made up the delegation!! I will be talking more about the conference in a future Word article.

On September 23, CBJ hosted the first of four speakers in the series Living with Courage: Messages of Unity. This event was sponsored by CBJ, the Niagara Foundation, and St. Mark Lutheran Church. Arizona State Representative Daniel Hernandez, Jr. told his story about being a Hispanic-American hero whose voice helps to shape the laws in our country. Participating in this event left me with such a feeling of hope, and I am so thankful for our partnership with the other religious groups.

As you know, September kicks off the High Holy Day season. Our Selichot services were different this year. While change can be difficult, I believe it worked in this scenario. I truly enjoyed learning with the rest of the community on Sunday and the delicious brunch that followed. If you couldn't join me this year, I hope you will be able to do so next year.

This year, due to the unfortunate antisemitic events that have occurred over the past year, security processes are going to be tighter during the High Holy Days. In the past, we may not have been as diligent regarding the checking of tickets as we wished. That will not be the case this year. In order to enter the services, every person over the age of 17 needs to have a ticket. I ask that you are patient this year as our volunteer ushers check your tickets. While it is a so sad that we must implement these policies, it is imperative that we feel safe while worshipping together. If you have any questions regarding the security protocols, please do not hesitate to contact me.

During Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, we will again have services for all age groups for all to connect spiritually during these holy days. Tot High Holiday services are on Rosh Hashanah Day 1 and Yom Kippur. Both services are from 9:00 AM until 9:45 AM at Buffalo Grove High School. These services are free and open to the community, but reservations are REQUIRED through the synagogue office. Family Services are on Rosh Hashanah Day 1 and Yom Kippur at Buffalo Grove High School. Both services are from 10:30 to 12:30 PM. Youth and Teen Services will be held on both days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur from 10:30 to 12:30 PM at Congregation Beth Judea. Also, there will be a Kol Nidre Youth Service from 6:00 to 7:30 PM. Another service to consider attending is the Insight Addition Service (formerly known as the Parallel Service or Alternative Service) on Rosh Hashanah Day 2. Led by Norm Kurtz and Gregg Pollack, this service is an interactive alternative to the Rosh Hashanah Day 2 service at the synagogue. The location is changed this year to the Double Tree Hotel in Mundelein from 9:00 to 12:00 PM. This service is a personal favorite of mine. I will be there – please join me!!

HESED COMMITTEE

Congregation Beth Judea is more than just a building. It is a *caring community*, and we are here to help each other in times of need.

The Hesed committee consists of dedicated volunteers who want to support our congregants when they need it most. As such, we offer a variety of services that we hope will be helpful to our CBJ congregants. The committee has five (5) sub-committees, outlined below, that would welcome the opportunity to be of assistance. Please let us know if you need assistance by calling the synagogue office or emailing the Hesed chairs Marilyn Green-Rebnord or Evan Rumack at hesed.cbj@gmail.com. Confidentiality is one of our major concerns, so **please do not be embarrassed to ask for our help.** Only our chairs and the volunteer will know.

- ❖ If you are ill — **and** give permission to our clergy or office staff — we will try to have a committee member call to see how you are doing and if you need anything. This may include a hospital, rehab facility, home, or skilled nursing care visit during your illness.
- ❖ If you need help getting to a doctor's appointment, religious services, synagogue programs, or such errands as prescription pickup, our committee is set up to help you. While we may not always be able to make such arrangements, we will do our best.
- ❖ Should you have a loss, we will try to arrange for a committee member to stay at the shiva house during the funeral service so the house will not be unattended, and no family member or friend need miss the service. We will be there to accept deliveries, but not to set up the kitchen. Rabbi will ask you if you would like this help when he is contacted. For security reasons, you will be told in advance who is coming to your home.
- ❖ Should you need, the committee will try to arrange to attend the evening minyan at the shiva home to ensure that a minyan is present to enable mourners to say kaddish. Minyan leaders are also willing to help.
- ❖ At the end of shloshim, we will contact you to check in during your bereavement. It is our intention that this period will be marked during the evening minyan by acknowledging your loved one's name and by dedicating the reading of a psalm to them and inviting you to the service.

New Mussar Course Offered This Fall

We enter the month of Elul and the High Holy Days thinking about our own personal spiritual transformation. It is in our own hands to decide who we will become. If you would like to explore a Jewish pathway for growing toward wholeness (*shleimut*) and holiness (*kedushah*), focused on practical steps you can take to internalize the teachings of our Torah so that they become part of who you are, the study of Mussar can be a guide. Mussar opens an opportunity to deal with the parts of yourself that are less than whole, for those are the aspects that define *your personal spiritual curriculum*.

Some of our congregation have already embarked upon studying Mussar in small groups and have seen how this Jewish pathway can lead to a more spiritually fulfilled life. The core teaching of Mussar is that our inner essence is inherently holy but is obscured by extremes of emotion or habits which veil that inner light. Our task in life is to transform the “veils” and uncover the brilliant light of the soul.

We are excited to open a *NEW* course this fall called *A Season of Mussar*. This course uses Jewish texts, group discussion, and spiritual exercises to explore various middot, or soul-traits. In this course, you will learn a set of practical tools that lead to realizing your highest spiritual potential, including an everyday practice which helps you focus on personal growth. This is a wonderful opportunity to meet regularly in a very small group within the congregation in meaningful and confidential sessions to form a close, trusting community within our larger whole. This course does not require knowledge of Hebrew, or any prior experience.

In *A Season of Mussar* runs for 13 weeks, with each *middah* studied intensely for two weeks, so that 6 *midot* are studied in the full program: Humility, Anger, Gratitude, Trust, Honor, and Enthusiasm.



Congregation Beth Judea is partnering with BJE Chicago, Marshall Center, HIAS Immigration & Citizenship, JCFS Chicago, and local synagogues to provide basic provisions to refugees on the southern border during Sukkot. ***One Mitzvah, One Community*** is designed to supply needed toiletries and writing implements to the Interfaith Welcome Coalition (IWC) of San Antonio, Texas for inclusion in the backpack kits they distribute to hundreds of refugees each week.

Being part of this initiative provides our students and families an opportunity to put mitzvot in action. One of the major themes of Sukkot is our responsibility to help one another. Like the Israelites that traversed through the desert, the burden of the migrants on the southern border is great. They are in an unknown place, in temporary quarters, and unsure when they will get provisions. We cannot change the realities of the situation, but we can lighten their burden as they are in the fragile place of the wandering exile.






