President's Message

A Dedication to Learning, A Commitment to the Future

Dear Friends,

As the shofar sounded on Rosh Hashanah, we welcomed not only a new year but also a new chapter in the life of our congregation. Together, we dedicated and named our religious school for our beloved congregant Barbara Robbins, affirming our commitment to Jewish learning for our children and generations to come. It was a joyful reminder that our synagogue is built on vision, generosity, and the strength of our shared values.

Although I am President of Congregation Beth Judea, I am also a parent. Both my sons are "graduates" of our religious school. My older son Emmet, now a sophomore in college and active in Hillel, continues his Jewish journey solidly built on the foundations of Judaism and community he learned here at CBJ. My younger son, Jacob (aka JJ) – age 16, now proudly serves as a madrich—an assistant teacher—in our religious school. I have seen firsthand the warmth, the learning, and the sense of Jewish pride that happens within these walls and carries forward into early adulthood. Simply put, the religious school at CBJ is exceptional.

But a strong school requires continued investment—in classrooms, in teachers, in curriculum, supplies, and technology, along with a physical space that fosters learning and community. Four years ago, the leadership at CBJ recognized that while our religious school program was excellent, tuition to cover religious school costs was becoming a barrier for attendance. A family with two children in school was paying close to \$3000 a year in tuition. Enrollment was declining. With vision and determination, Rabbi Zimbalist and past presidents, including our immediate past president Adam Barshefsky, created Project 613.

Named for the number of mitzvot found in the Torah, 613 dollars became the new flat tuition rate for synagogue members with children in grades 1-7. Kindergarten is free. A handful of generous congregants came together to raise the funds to launch this new tuition structure in 2023. Thanks to their generosity, the number of new students in our religious school has grown. Now, with the gift from the Robbins family in honor of Barbara, Project 613 is secured for many years to come.

President's Message

In addition, this gift helps us face the reality of a building in need of renewal and revitalization. The school wing, where so much of our children's Jewish learning takes place, needs updates and modernization to the physical space. The Robbins family gift serves as a cornerstone of our upcoming capital campaign—named Eit Ratzon, "The Time is Now." This campaign, which you will be hearing more about soon, will launch in November. When complete, the campaign will allow us to revitalize our school classroom space. We plan to upgrade the aging floor, ceiling, and bathrooms. We will add new and brighter lighting, and we will convert rooms to serve multipurpose functions that can accommodate additional usage such as preschool education programs, teen youth group social events, and space for small prayer gatherings.

With an affordable, high-quality education and revitalized learning space, everyone who walks into our religious school will be touched by the Robbins family's legacy of learning, generosity, and commitment to Jewish life.

On behalf of the board of directors, our clergy, staff, and the entire synagogue family, I want to thank Barbara Robbins, her children Larry and Ellen, and their entire family. May this dedication be a blessing to them, and to every child who will grow within these walls. We are deeply grateful.

A special thank you as well to Rabbi Zimbalist—gifts like this happen because of the trust and admiration inspired by his leadership.

You will find the newly unveiled name and beautiful logo in the stairwell entrance to the school. G'mar Chatimah Tovah.

A Message from the Principal of Your Religious School, The Barbara Robbins School for Jewish Learning

Parents, as many of you have seen, Jewish education at Beth Judea is very much experiential and hands-on. Your students get to hear the sound of the Shofar on many occasions during the High Holidays, to shake the lulav and etrog in our Sukkah during Sukkot, and (above) get rid of their "sins" in our backyard pond and look forward to a better New Year.

I am so excited to be the leader of our school during my first High Holidays at Beth Judea. We were able to accommodate many families who wanted to pray in the Sanctuary, while their kids had a fun and meaningful experience downstairs in our school. I am so grateful for the programs implemented by our wonderful Cantor over her past four years here.

We are also so fortunate to have our leaders and teachers teaching and experiencing Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur together in our school.

What's next?

First, Yom Kippur is this week. For Kol Nidre, our youngest students – kindergarten, first, and second grade – will have a program downstairs, while grades 3 through 7 will be with their families at the Kol Nidre service. This once-a-year service is meaningful and beautiful, and it must be experienced together. On Yom Kippur, we have a full youth service program in our school wing from 10:20am – 12:30pm.

Next week comes Sukkot. All our students will lovingly decorate our community Sukkah. All students will have a wonderful snack together in the Sukkah and will have a chance to shake the etrog and lulav and recite the prayers.

The following week is Simchat Torah. In this Torah parade, your students will march and dance with the Torah, with their families, in joyous song and dance. We celebrate the ending of the Torah reading, and the beginning of a new Torah reading cycle, beginning with B'reishit, Genesis.

October 24-25 - our 5th, 6th, & 7th grades will enjoy ShabbabaFest. This overnight Kallah is part of our religious school curriculum. Our students will join with students from other area congregations for an amazing overnight Shabbat experience. Marc Sender, Cantor Bat-Sarah, Parker Weber, Sara Reid, and I – and other leaders in the Jewish community - will ensure your students have an amazing time!

On Sunday, October 26, there will be class. However, those students who attend ShabbabaFest will not be expected to attend Religious School that Sunday.



Olivia Erin Chertow


Olivia Erin (לאה חיה) Chertow will be called to the Torah as a Bat Mitzvah on Saturday, November 1, 2025.




