### **UPGRADES**

There have been many exciting upgrades to our building. Six NEW basketball backboards/hoops have been installed; two with adjustable heights for our younger students. NEW Projectors in Grades 2, 3, 6, and 8 have been installed. Whiteboards have been installed in all our upper school classrooms. The PA system has been extended to reach the playground, computer room, art and gymnasium. A Security Guard will now be present at our school entrance and/or for evening events as needed. Additional upgrades have been made, according to code, in the kitchen and throughout the building. The building has been cleaned thoroughly and our shiny floors are beautiful! We purchased new carpets for the gym and 8th grade entrances. # Welcoming Our New Teachers!

Cecilia Rodriguez (2<sup>nd</sup> Grade) is an experienced teacher with a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Connecticut and a Master of Science degree from the University of Bridgeport. She majored in Elementary education and is certified in the state of Connecticut to teach Pre-K through Grade 8. She is also trained in the Orton Gillingham Reading program. Mrs. Rodriguez has been working with the Diocese of Bridgeport for many years. She believes that the fundamental purpose of a Catholic school, its mission, is to teach as Jesus did. Mrs. Rodriguez models the teachings of the Gospel by supporting every child as they learn to know, love and serve the Lord. She credits her Catholic school upbringing for making her the person she is today and considers it a privilege to give back to the system that has given her so much.

Annmarie Winington (3<sup>rd</sup> Grade) is excited and thrilled to join St. Aloysius School as our third grade teacher. She is returning to teaching full-time after working part time while caring for her two daughters, Emily and Elizabeth. She is a firm believer in Catholic education, the values it instills in children, as well as the family atmosphere it fosters. She has stated that in St. Aloysius she has found the perfect mix of academic excellence, family values, and Catholic education.

Annmarie began her career at Public School 108 in the Bronx, New York. She stayed there until starting a family. She then accepted a position teaching math and chemistry at night to post secondary students at Lincoln Technical Institute. This way, she could still pursue her passion for teaching, but be home with her children during the day. Once her kids were school age, she accepted a position at Saints Philip and James School in New Jersey. This was her first experience with Catholic education and she fell in love. She enjoyed the ability to openly speak about God, values, and character education. She vowed she would continue in this tradition from this point forward in her career. Her husband's career then took them to Connecticut, where she began teaching at Christ and Holy Trinity Preschool in Westport.
