Our first Alabama Bicentennial Ramble weekend begins with the history of the Creek Indians and the early settlers in the Stockton area. Visit Fort Mims, the site of the Massacre that started the Creek Wars. Hear oral histories from descendants of these settlers.

In Atmore, the Poarch Creek Indian Museum explains the culture and history of the people. At Baldwin County's Bicentennial Park, constructed structures of Creek Indian culture continue the story.

Dinner at the famous Stagecoach Cafe will round out the weekend with stories of the Federal Road!
