## TVIH Survey

Periodically, TVIH sends out surveys to gauge members' evaluations of the organization and its activities. This data helps in making changes and planning for the future. The latest survey, skillfully constructed and analyzed by Fran Dummett and Marie Grunwell, was conducted in September 2021 when we were operating under COVID restrictions. At that time, there were 166 TVIH members, and 95 (57%) responded to the survey. The survey was designed to obtain input describing who we are, why we joined TVIH, whether the organization has fulfilled expectations, and what improvements TVIH might make. These are the answers provided by the 95 respondents.

### Who are the Villagers?

Of the respondents, 88% are 71 years or older. The median age category was 76-80. Only 3% were younger than 65. The survey data came overwhelmingly from associate members (82%). Members who are couples account for 30% of the sample.

### How and why do people join the Village?

Our best recruitment tool is through social connections. Half the members (51%) heard about TVIH through friends, and they were attracted to the Village

because of the opportunity to make new friends (64%) and avoid social isolation (24%). They were also interested in the activities (63%) that TVIH offered. Many write-in comments on the survey mentioned a desire to render service to the TVIH community and beyond.

### Has TVIH met expectations?

The survey indicated broad participation in TVIH, perhaps because the people who responded to the survey were also the most active in TVIH. Only 3% said they had not participated in TVIH events. Over half of the respondents participated in various educational programs and social gatherings such as lunch bunch and happy hour. Another 40-49% mentioned attending morning walks, age-related and health-related information talks, and musical programs. 43% of the group had served as volunteers. The satisfaction ratings were very high at 90%.

What suggestions were made for the future?

Responses to the current survey led to some popular recent TVIH programming, including the Speakeasy series and the series on housing. The survey also provided a wish list for future program planning: more health and wellness programs (74%) and weekend programs (58%) were high on the list. These require staffing and volunteers. Where might the staffing come from? 43% of the respondents noted their willingness to find ways to capitalize on their skills and experience by volunteering, and 29% stated the desire to participate in outreach to community organizations. We have yet to learn whether people followed up on their offers. The present survey suggests that we track the extent of volunteering and offer more opportunities for engagement in the organization and community. We need people to engage in volunteering and monitoring as well as coordinating our volunteer efforts.
