## TVIH Board Sets Membership Dues for 2023

At its September meeting, the TVIH Board of Directors approved a new budget for 2023. It includes an increase in membership dues effective January 1, 2023. The new dues will be as follows:

- Associate Member (individual) will increase from \$173 to \$180.
- Associate Member (couple) will increase from \$289 to \$305.
- Full Member (individual) will increase from \$404 to \$425.
- Full Member (couple) will increase from \$520 to \$545.

The approved increase is just under five percent.

This is the first dues increase in two years as TVIH did not increase dues in 2022. However, this year has seen some large increases in expected expenses. For 2023, membership dues

cover just under 33 percent of our total budget. The remainder is covered by fundraising activities, grants, and drawdown of reserves.

Members who renew their membership before the end of calendar year 2022 will be able to renew at current rates and avoid the increase for 2023. Those who meet income criteria may be eligible for a reduced-rate membership. For further information, please contact Cheryl Neely at the office.

## 2022 PODS SURVEY RESULTS - Michele Millican

In early Sept. 2022, a survey was sent to 91 TVIH members who participated in Pods from Sept. 2021 to Aug. 2022. There was a 58% response rate. These respondents were generally satisfied, giving the Pods activity a 3.5 rating on a 5-point scale. Members of Pods praised them for offering interesting conversations and comradery in a small group setting. These evaluations were exactly what the Pods leadership had hoped: Pods decreased feelings of isolation and increased participation in TVIH activities.

However, the informal structure of Pods, which fostered easy interactions, also created problems for roughly a quarter of the participants. They noted that the Pods were too disorganized and lacked definite goals, sometimes leading to low attendance. Pods members suggested some struc-

tural changes, such as determining a standard meeting date and time and assigning a set role or responsibility to each Pod member.

The survey led the Pods Committee to plan to create a Pods framework and guidelines to assure success. The structure would be incorporated in Pods documents, a website, marketing, and the design of the initial meeting of each Pod, which a Pods Committee member would facilitate. After informing the Pods Committee, the guidelines would permit Pods to dissolve if they chose. The Pods Committee would also be notified when a new Pod was created or new members were added to a current Pod. The Pods Committee would also act as an outreach committee in managing the waiting list for each Pod and seeking new membership for Pods.

Michele was praised as a great example of someone who pursues her passion for helping others and embeds her work within the mission of TVIH, thereby enriching the TVIH organization.

## **2023 MEMBERSHIP DUES**

The Board of Directors approved an annual 5% membership fee increase beginning January 1, 2023. Please refer to the article entitled “TVIH BOARD SETS MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR 2023” for details about the dues increase.

The 2023 BUDGET was approved. The draft budget incorporates committee requests and assumes TVIH will hire an Executive Director or Manager and continue Sarah Ziemann.

## **HIRING COMMITTEE REPORT - Jim Bouscaren**

The Hiring Committee consists of Jim Sanders, Fran Dummett, Fran Lorenzi, Sheryl Amster, Cheryl Neely, and Jim Bouscaren. Initially, their weekly meetings have focused on defining the role of Manager and Executive Director to decide which role TVIH seeks to fill. They presented ideas and findings to the TVIH legacy members via Zoom on Monday, October 3, 2022, at 3:00 pm. Input from these discussions and the committee's recommendations will be presented to the Board of Directors before the October 26th Board meeting.

A short bio of the Board nominees, Marsha

## Healthy Aging Workgroup News

Howard County General Hospital (HCGH) has established The Patient-Family Advisory Council (PFAC) over several years. The Mission is “to improve the patient and family experience across the continuum of care in the Johns Hopkins Health System.” This is accomplished with set goals and objectives that are being refined at this writing. In essence, they include 1) facilitating best practices; and 2) ensuring that the patient/family perspectives and voices are heard.

Various clinically-specific advisory councils are in place or evolving. Each includes representatives from the administrative and clinical staff and the hospital-wide PFAC. TVIH's interests (age-related care) are currently represented on the hospital-wide PFAC by Judy Goldfarb.
