Searching for Individual CA Village Grants

The Fund-raising committee would like to contact all CA villages to see if they have grants or donations available for local non-profits that serve residents of their village. We have already contacted Oakland Mills, Long Reach and Wilde Lake. We are asking Village members that may live in other CA villages to contact their village association and ask if they have a grant or donation program. If they do, please request a copy of the application and send it to Pete Brunner @ grants@thevillageinhoward.gov.

Your village association may want to know how many TVIH members live within their village (e.g., Hickory Ridge). You can get the answer by logging into the website and checking the membership directory under the Resources tab. This will bring up a window that allows you to click on “Metro Area” and select your neighborhood. The system will then bring up all TVIH members living in your village.

Oakland Mills has generously donated \$500 per year for the past several years and we are hopeful other villages may also provide us with some resources.

Moving Together Strengthens Bonds

When they walk past, you notice their smiles. Two dozen people, ages 55 and older, are strolling through The Mall in Columbia together, some deep in conversation, others peacefully taking in the scenery at 9 in the morning.

They're all members of The Village in Howard, a movement of seniors who aim to age in place in their own homes. Their sense of connection is deep: walking together, they are friends, caregivers, and care receivers for each other and for the wider community.

"I think of this as the therapy of walking and talking," said John Salkeld, who convenes the weekly walks in the mall and around Lake Kittamaqundi. "We walk for 30 minutes in the mall, and we always do both floors."

Sometimes drawing more than 50 people, the mall walks are one of many activities organized by the volunteers of the Villages of Howard. They also organize and attend presentations, most recently on electric cars and housing for seniors.

Exercise is a big part of their lives. Larry Fenton, who lives in the Residences at Vantage Point, said he comes because he loves both the people and the physical movement. "It adds to the wealth of my health," he said.

Joy Cheung, one of the 12 founders who helped start The Village in Howard in 2015 by modeling it after other "Age In Place" Villages across the nation, said she wants the local organization to

keep growing. The Village in Howard is in the process of hiring an executive director.

"There are 50,000 65+ seniors in Howard County and we only have 178 members," she said.

At the mall, the conversations are often full of spark, intellect, and humor. From a retired cardiologist, to someone who worked for Bethlehem Steel for more than 30 years, to a retired nurse who is still deeply involved in promoting wellness in Howard County, they talk about issues that challenge the world.

"And we talk about books," added Cheung, "We have four retired librarians!"

On Boarding Board of Directors Meeting February 8, 2023

Financial Report: Peter Brunner

The Board is being asked to consider how to advocate for expanded State support for the Village. We would like to include the Executive Director in these decisions. The first step could be composing a template letter to distribute to the Board and TVIH members requesting their help in promoting support from the Secretary of the Department of Aging, as well as the Howard County Representative on the State Subcommittee for Local Finances.

Personnel Issues

Peter Brunner has agreed to stay on as Treasurer until the end of March and is flexible if more time is needed. Jim Sanders resigned from the Board of Directors and TVIH committees, but will continue his Village membership and help Judy Goldfarb with THWAG. Jim Bouscaren updated the Board on the work of the Hiring Committee for an Executive Director. On

January 25, the committee sent out 4 rejection letters and 7 acceptance letters requesting 3 reference letters. Five candidates sent in letters of reference and interviews will be on Monday, Feb. 13 and Wed., Feb. 15.

The Board is considering adding outside directors who could offer a broader external perspective and broaden our connections to the County. The Board will consult with the new Executive Director before a decision is made.

The following Village positions are open: Director of Public Affairs, Trainee for Director of Finance, Communication Committee Chair, Outreach Committee Chair, Newsletter Editor, and Chair and members of a newly established Succession Planning Committee. Once chosen, the Executive Director should have input on these personnel decisions. The Board is working on revising the Village Organizational Chart and By-laws to incorporate the Executive Director and revisions to committee structures and functions.

Hearing Impaired Equipment – John Marsch

The Board discussed acquiring and installing hearing aids in our Steven's Forest Office. More information is needed to determine installation requirements and costs. The Board will research these issues and discuss them at the next meeting.

Loan Closet of Howard County

The Loan Closet of Howard County connects individuals with medical equipment (e.g., walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, bedrails, shower chairs, and much more) on a loan basis, free of charge. To receive equipment, your healthcare professional must complete the Loan Closet Referral Form at <https://www.howardcountymd.gov/disability-services>. Once the referral is received, you will be contacted to schedule an appointment for pick-up.

The Loan Closet of Howard County is located at 7125 Riverwood Drive, Suite D1, Columbia, MD 21046. Appointments are required for all services—Call 410-313-0363 to discuss your needs or ask for a referral form.
