Palms for our Palm Sunday celebration

Every year Plymouth and congregations worldwide celebrate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem by waving palm branches.

In 2007 the PC(USA) teamed up with Lutheran World Relief, Catholic Relief Services and the University of Minnesota to offer congregations the option of purchasing responsibly harvested Eco-Palm branches for Palm Sunday. The palms we are using come from communities in Mexico and Guatemala where workers are paid fairly and engage in sustainable harvesting in order to protect the local ecosystem. Spring Clean-Up


The last Saturday in April (4/29) and the first Saturday in May (5/6) will be our annual spring clean-up, from 8 AM to noon both days. Let Gordon Dosher know your availability and what you'd like to work on. We would love to have as many people participate as can. Most things could be done individually on different date, if one of those Saturdays does not work for you. Here is a list of things we normally do:

- Oil/polish the sanctuary pews and other sanctuary furniture (polish will be provided)
- Wash the inside windows in sanctuary, offices, and Fireside Room and all outside windows.
 Needed: step stool, rags, bucket, squeegee, vinegar (or another favorite window cleaner)
- Replace furnace and air handler filters
- Rinse off kitchen air handler filter
- Drain water heaters
- Put away winter supplies (shovels, sand, etc.)
- Inspect and, if necessary, clean HVAC vents
- Sweep parking lot. Needed: push brooms, scoop shovel, leaf blower
- Clean space under entry rugs (remove rugs, clean space under rugs, replace rugs)
- Pick up trash on lot
- Get snowblower ready for summer

Search Process

Plymouth Presbyterian Church has begun the process to search for a new pastor. The first step was to get a Transitional Pastor who could help guide you through the steps. Now we need to gather information from the congregation about who you are, where you want to be going, and what kind of a pastor can help you move forward. Some of the work was already completed last summer when you had church-wide gatherings led by Pastor Jeff and the Strategic Planning Committee.

When will we start the process of searching for a new called pastor?

The quick answer is it has already started. Penny Blankenship together with Pastor Carol reviewed the notes of last summer's meetings. There was an opportunity for the congregation to join in the work of what is next for the church on March 12.

If you missed the meeting on March 12, you can still have your voice heard! Speak with either Penny Blankenship or Pastor Carol. Then please plan to attend the meeting following worship on March 19. We want to hear from as many members and friends as possible!

What is the difference between a called pastor and a transitional pastor?

Both are pastors who lead the church, preach and administer the sacraments, provide pastoral care, serve as moderator of the Session and head of staff, work with the various committees and organizations in the church, all the task any pastor does. The difference is that a "called" pastor has been voted on by the congregation while a "transitional" pastor comes to the church with the specific purpose of serving the church during a search time.

What are the next steps?

The Strategic Planning team will be collating information gathered at the meetings as well as other information that will be compiled into what is called a Mission Study. Once that is completed, it will be submitted to the Commission on Ministry of Presbytery. Once they sign off on it a Pastor Nominating Committee can be elected.

How long will this all take?

It is impossible to say, but most churches find it takes at least a year to move through the process and call a new pastor. That sounds like a long time, but in the meantime, there are things you can be doing to help. Participate when there are meetings as the Strategic Planning team helps us do some long-range planning and collecting information from the congregation. Prayerfully consider serving on the Pastor Nominating Committee. And everyone in the congregation can join in prayer for the church during this search process.

If you have questions or concerns or want an update, always feel free to talk with Pastor Carol.




Book Club


Volunteer
