Day of Pentecost


When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.

Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. ~Acts 2:1-4

Pentecost in the church we always read from Acts 2 about the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and other believers. Pentecost has sometimes been called the birthday of the church because believers began to move outside their own small community to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with others.

We traditionally use the color red in worship to represent the colors of fire and the Holy Spirit touching those who had gathered. Join us for worship on Pentecost Sunday, May 28, and remember to wear red or orange or yellow.



The focus of the Pentecost special offering is children and youth programs. 40% of the offering received will be used locally as Plymouth Presbyterian Church decides. The offering is received until May 28th.

Tech Corner Update

"How to access live-streaming and archived 'on-demand' church services"

Do you know that our worship services are streamed live over the internet for you to worship remotely? They are also archived for later viewing at a time more convenient to you. The ability to live-stream our worship services has been a blessing to our congregation in many ways and we are grateful to and thank our previous pastor, Rev. Jeff Foels, who was instrumental in getting it set-up and working. Not only are members and guests able to view the stream from home while isolating from sickness or otherwise home-bound, but our well-traveled members can view the stream while traveling, whether from up-north, from overseas, or from their snow-bird nests! Additionally, since our services are publicly available, anyone interested in learning more about our congregation can and have easily done so.

There are two ways to watch the services online.

1. Church Website

Go to the church website at https://plymouthpc.org/worship/ and scroll down for the service you are interested in.




Note, however, that the live-stream won't be available on our website until the stream has actually been started! This typically occurs about 5 to 10 min prior to the start of the service. To get notified when the live-stream is available, subscribe to the church YouTube channel, as described next.

The church website contains a link to that service's printed bulletin to enhance your worship experience. Also, in case the your internet browser fails to play the service video, we include a link for you to directly access the YouTube video stream.

2. YouTube

Go to the PPC YouTube channel (PlymouthPresbyterianChurchMN) at https://www.youtube.com/@PlymouthPresbyterianChurchMN/streams (see below) and select the worship service to watch.



If the streaming hasn't yet started, it

will be labeled "UPCOMING" as shown below and you can click on the "Notify me" button, and YouTube will notify you when the live-stream begins. At this time, the printed bulletin must be viewed on the church website.

Compost Bins

We have added compost bins at Plymouth Presbyterian. They are located next to the outside door next to the kitchen. We and Bloom are putting compostable materials to the bins. "Green" compost materials include vegetable and fruit scraps and green vegetation. We are avoiding putting grass in as it often has pesticides. "Brown" compost materials include dead vegetation (like fallen leaves and old plant stems), paper towels, shredded paper, and coffee grounds. Egg shells can also be added as a calcium source. For small-scale composting like this, we avoid large pieces of paper as the heat generated is not enough to break them down. For good composting, there should be a ratio of about 1/3 green material and 2/3 brown material. If you have a bag of leaves or shredded paper you want to get rid of, drop it off at the church or dump it in one of the bins. Bloom is generating enough green material from their kitchen so you don't have to bring any from home. While at church, though, you can through paper towels and coffee filters and grounds in the bins.

Presbyterian roots go deep in Scotland

St. Giles Cathedral, Edinburgh, Scotland

Visit Scotland, especially historic sites, and you find references to the Protestant Reformer, John Knox. Christianity had existed in Scotland since before the sixth century AD. But it changed dramatically when Knox returned from Geneva, Switzerland where he had been influenced by the teachings of another Protestant Reformer, John Calvin.

John Knox was known as a fiery preacher and key instigator in Scotland's dramatic break with the Catholic Church. In 1592, a full Presbyterian system was adopted by the Scottish Church and Parliament. (https://www.churchofscotland.org.uk/about-us/our -faith/history) The new system had power resting not with bishops and a pope but with ministers and elders, the Session, Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly. Sound familiar? We Presbyterians follow the same structure in this county.

Visit Scotland and you see Presbyterian Churches, although a church sign may say: The Church of Scotland. (If you watched any of the recent coronation of King Charles, you heard about the Church of England which is Anglican or what we in the U.S. call Episcopalian.)

It was exciting to visit Scotland and see where our Presbyterian roots are so deep. My thanks to all who helped in my absence, and to Rev. Chris Hagen and Rev. Erica Schemper for leading worship.


