HOLY WEEK

In the church's mission statement, we say that we celebrate Jesus Christ as the driving force in our lives. As we have journeyed through Lent and are now in Holy Week, the events that unfold have a driving force of their own. In the

Gospels, there comes in each of them a point somewhere in the middle where it becomes time for Jesus to start heading toward Jerusalem – narratively as well as literally. Palm Sunday becomes the first crisis point there, where the rubber meets the road, and Jesus' ministry comes in clear conflict with the authorities of church and state.

From there, events continue quicker – the upper room with disciples for a last supper, Maundy Thursday. And then the driving force brings Jesus' betrayal, being handed over to the authorities, arrested, tried before the crowds, sent to die on the cross. The events from Sunday through Good Friday have a kind of immediacy and pace that feel like a continual acceleration to the cross – and then....silence.

After Good Friday, it seems the story is over. There is silence, the last movement seems finished. And yet, as people of faith, we know that Easter comes. We know that resurrection comes, we know that death does not have the last word. This week though, this Holy Week, we live in that silence all the same, all the better to understand what comes on Easter.

Wishing you all a contemplative and meaningful Holy Week, and looking forward to Easter.
