
Thank You!

First-Aid Equipment at Church

There have been a lot of questions lately on the availability of first-aid equipment in the church. We have an automated defibrillator (AED) and first-aid kits. The AED is located on the wall of the hall next to the kitchen. Building and Grounds keeps the battery and pads up-to-date via a schedule. The AED is fully automatic. Once you open it, it starts speaking instructions as to what to do, where to place pads, etc.

In addition, there is a full first-aid kit in the kitchen near the door to the Narthex. There is also a first-aid kit in the office. Thanks to *Pam Koehler* and *Carol Reed* for getting the office first-aid kit stocked.

Per Capita

Did you know that individual Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations pay the denomination a set amount for each individual member on its rolls? Those fees help support the materials and services we use (like assistance the church will receive with the pastor search process), and it provides funds for the greater mission of the denomination. Part of per capita goes to our local Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area, part goes to our Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and part goes to the national denomination.

The per capita amount for 2024 is \$38.50. If you are able to pay for each individual member within your household, that helps Plymouth's own budget!
