A Letter From The Pastor

Dear People of Plymouth Presbyterian Church,

As we celebrate the Coming of the Christ Child, and we again welcome the Presence of God into our lives, I thank you for welcoming me as your bridge pastor for these four months. I have been touched by your hospitality and welcoming spirit, and grateful for the leaders and members of this church who have both supported my work and heard my hopes for Plymouth Presbyterian.

When I served here ten years ago, one of my responsibilities was to take the children out of worship during the closing hymn, gathering them for a song and prayer before they went to their Sunday School classes. It's a favorite memory of my time here, so I have been aware of the shift in the congregation these past years.

When I serve a church, I hold it before God in prayer. I am concerned with the number of members who use to be in worship, but have not returned to the sanctuary or active involvement in the church, I assume because of COVID. But I firmly believe the Holy Spirit has plans for this church, and I will continue to hold the future of this wonderful congregation in my prayers after I complete this time with you. May you each be led to be part of the visioning and implementation of future plans, and may the mission and ministries flourish!

My final Sunday is January 1, which is during the Season of Christmas (12 days, through Epiphany). The Reverend Howard Thurman reminds us that Christmas is more than one day:

"When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with the flocks, then the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal those broken in spirit, to feed the hungry, to release the oppressed, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among all peoples, to make a little music with the heart. And to radiate the Light of Christ every day, in every way, in all that we do and in all that we say. Then the work of Christmas begins."

May you engage in the work of Christmas throughout the year, and may the Spirit of God flourish within and among you!

She has experience working in the west metro suburbs while serving with Calvin Presbyterian Church in Long Lake. Carol Reed grew up in Minneapolis and received a Bachelor's of Science in Home Economics Education at the University of Wisconsin-Stout. She served as a teacher in Ocho Rios, Jamaica for two years before seminary. After graduating with a Master of Divinity from McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago, she was ordained to do mission service in Taegu, South Korea. She has served churches in Binghamton, NY, Milwaukee, WI, Long Lake, MN, plus interims in Binghamton, NY, Willmar, Minneapolis, and Melbourne, Australia. Message from COVID Response Committee

The following Covid Guidelines were approved at the November Session meeting.

- Vaccinations and up-to-date boosters are strongly encouraged, but proof of vaccination is not required.
- Wearing masks during the church service is strongly encouraged because of the medical community's projections of higher flu and COVID-19 numbers this winter.
- Handwashing and sanitizing are encouraged, and hand sanitizing stations will be provided.
- We have people at risk, so be aware of those wearing masks, and be sensitive to social distancing.
