The text for Sunday, March 10th was about Jesus in the wilderness for forty days. The

wilderness in Israel was the desert – more like Arizona high desert than Sahara sandy dunes, with rocks and dry vegetation that springs back to life when the rainy season comes. It can be hard to see ourselves in a desert in this land of 10,000 lakes...except for the months of the year when we're covered by snow. We can see a similar lifelessness outside. The green shoots and new buds might still be weeks away, and the snowy drifts do a good job of imitating the sandy dunes too.

When we're in wilderness places or desert places in our lives, we can know that God has been to the wilderness too. We can know that when we can't see the way through the blinding snow, God is with us. We know that when we are feeling overwhelmed in the persistent winter, God is with us. We know that God has been with us when the drifts tower over our heads, and we feel small. God is with us in our wilderness times, and sees us through.

We remain in prayer for Karen Kenzie and her family as her mother is on hospice in Florida. I am deeply grateful for the work of Kim Post in putting together the Grapevine and the bulletins, as well as to Melody Baker, Pat Johnson, Sally Ackerman, Lu Wilmot, and Carla Bahls for serving in the office and keeping us up to date while Karen is with her family.

Bloom Early Learning Update

The **Friends of Bloom/PPC** group will have an initial meeting after church on March 17th. All are welcome! If you can't attend but want to provide support for our new mission in small or big ways, please let Janet Menary or Suzy Robertson know.

Construction work has started on the **kitchen**. Until it is finished, slated for April 13, the kitchen is off limits to the congregation. All coffee supplies are in the kitchenette.

Center Director **Audrey Heavens** has been interviewing for an assistant director and teachers and finding prospective families. Bloom is accepting applications for children aged 6 weeks through 5 years from both scholarship and full-pay families. The center is opening May 15th. See Bloomearlylearning.org

On March 11th there was a meeting to explore the **naturescape playground** idea, using creative play areas where imagination is the driver. It will be a fenced-in area behind the Bloom classrooms.
