Participants will examine the influence of environmental design, negative caregiving climate, family dynamics and cultural factors on a child's behavior. Using resources from the Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (CSEFL), special consideration on how general, targeted and intensive interventions can be used for behavior will be outlined.
