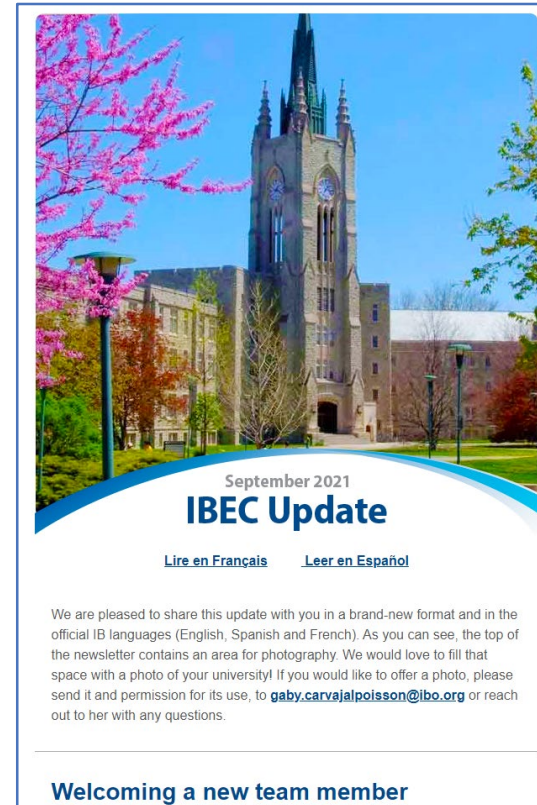

- anything else you would like other associations to know

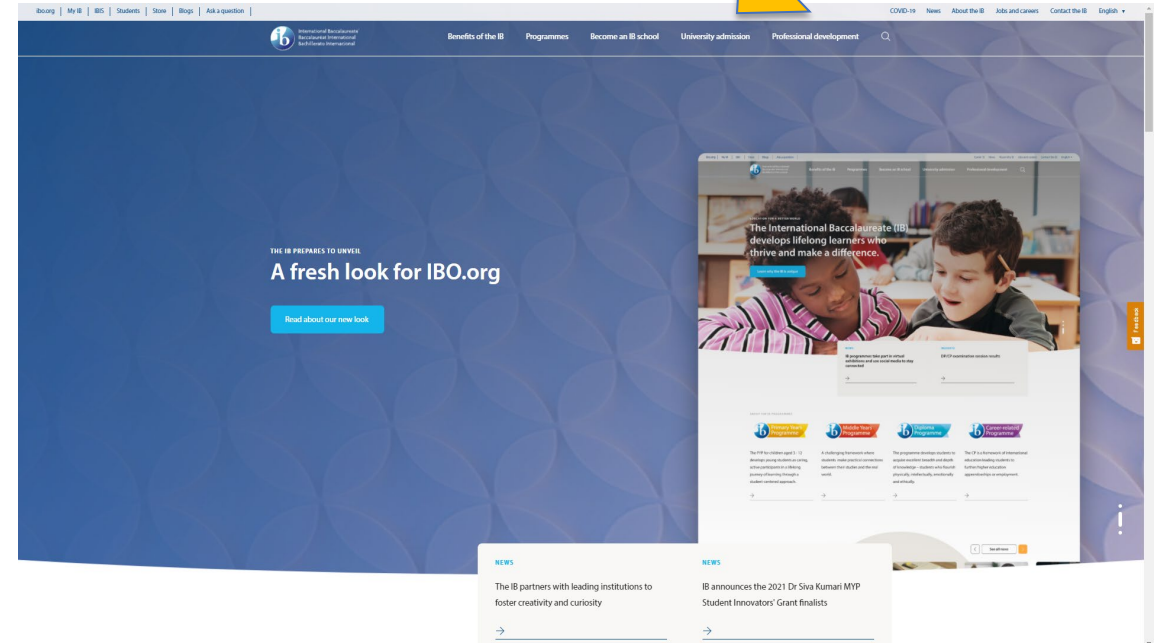

# University Advisory Groups

- We are in the process of setting up five of these groups, building on the success of CURC.
  - North America (CURC)
  - Africa, Middle East
  - Europe
  - Asia Pacific
  - Latin America
- Each group will have representation from around **ten** different countries, which receive the largest number of transcripts from IB students. A senior university admissions figure respected in their country, from a leading university will be the representative.
- Opportunity for two-way dialogue so that we gain intelligence on changes in the sector.
- Next meeting in October, then every six months



# Country Recognition Success Stories

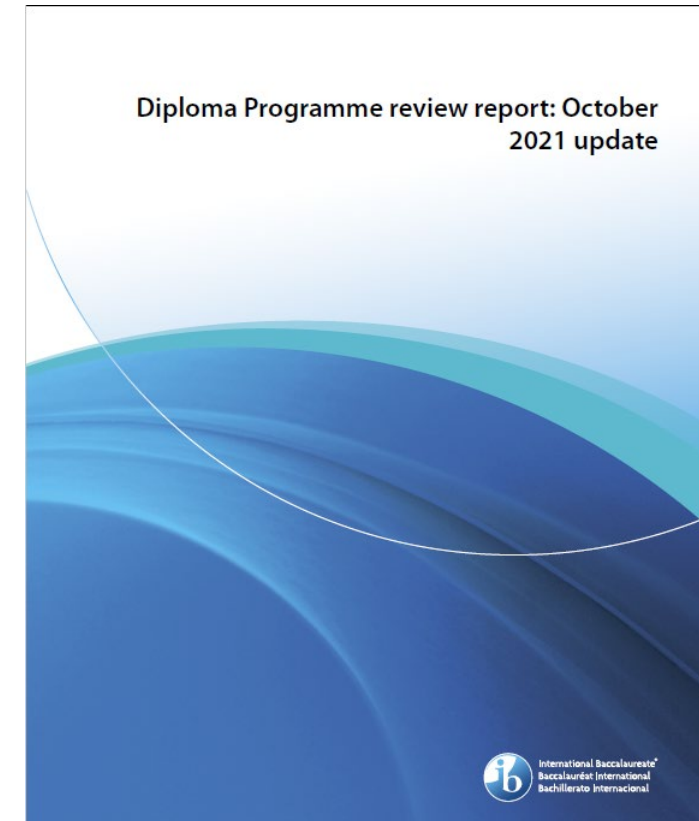
- Maintained the recognition of the M20, N20 and M21 sessions with universities and governments, including managing relationship with Ofqual(UK) and KMK (Germany)
- Solution in place for students to study Maths vectors for recognition in Germany
- IB CP is now recognized in Pakistan, India and Malaysia
- Ateneo de Manila University – providing credit for DP courses
- DP Courses are recognized in Qatar and improved DP recognition
- IB recognized in Zambia and Ethiopia
- Recognition statement from the Ukrainian government

# Country Recognition Success Stories (2)

- Agreement with Ministry of Education in Panama to start DP at several public schools
- Agreement with Virginia Dept of Education to accept IB sciences as advanced coursework for the state STEM Diploma
- Agreement with the Nevada Dept of Education to create a competitive grant process to increase number of IB programs in state – plan to at least triple the number of programs over the next five years
- Research : Comparing BTEC and IBCP students in UK context – reports favourably
- Research : Comparing GCSE and MYP grades completed
- Continuing to manage the relationship with Ofqual (UK), VRQA (Aus) and KMK (Ger), as well as dialogue with many other ministries at country, state and district level.

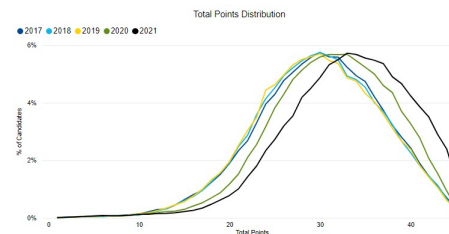
# Assessment Reminder

## • November 2021

- Dual route : 80% of schools on exam route, but only around 66% of students
- Adapted Assessment Model

## • May 2022

- Adapted Assessment Model
- Dual route confirmed
- Grade distribution half-way between 2019 and 2021



## • November 2022

- Adapted Assessment Model
- Dual route not confirmed

## • Beyond

- Return to standard assessment model
- Continued support for schools
- Dual route not confirmed

We are working with universities and governments to keep them abreast of these developments to ensure that recognition is maintained.
