

DON'T BE FOOLED!

Virginians: don't be fooled; Virginia governor candidate Abigail Spanberger is a wolf in sheep's clothing. Spanberger tries to portray herself as a moderate, but the facts reveal a different picture.

Spanberger is a dyed-in-the-wool liberal. Her voting record aligns with the far, far left. She has voted with liberal Nancy Pelosi more than 90 percent of the time. In Congress Spanberger voted against the Safeguard American Vote Act, which requires proof of identity and verification of U.S. citizenship when voting. Like many on the left, she believes it is okay for non-citizens to choose leaders who will rule America.

Spanberger also voted against the Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act. This act supports her position of allowing biological males to play in girls' sports. Disturbingly, recent reporting by the Washington Post indicates that Spanberger has received \$50,000 in campaign contributions from Pin Ni who is a Chinese businessman and member of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). It is worth noting that Virginia Law prohibits foreign nationals from making political donations in US elections. It is illegal for candidates to accept such donations. Spanberger also voted against a bill to block Chinese purchases of American farmland.

Don't be fooled. In this election, by using slick campaign ads, Abigail Spanberger portrays herself as a smooth, sensible, moderate candidate while she hides her true radical self as a wolf in sheep's clothing.
