VISION

To encourage active citizenship and community involvement from tomorrow's public service leaders

MISSION

- To provide a path of honest, meaningful, and reciprocal communication between the caring youth of the City of Miramar and the City's leaders
- To provide youth with an understanding of the inner-workings of municipal government
- To cultivate a sense of civic responsibility and public service
- To provide a safe and constructive learning environment
- To encourage and develop effective leadership skills
- To provide real world opportunities for active community service in the City of Miramar
- To acknowledge the civic involvement and contributions of the youth of the City of Miramar
- To learn and seek feedback from our youth regarding contemporary issues affecting the positive development of the youth of the City of Miramar

ORGANIZATION

- The Miramar Youth Advisory Council will be comprised of 14 High School students whose primary residence is in the City of Miramar
- Students in grades 10 through 12 are eligible for participation
- 9th & 10th grade students are encouraged to apply at the end of the school year for participation beginning in their 10th grade year
- Students from each High School consisting of two students from each applicable grade will be chosen for participation
- Students should aspire to assist the City of Miramar in its growth and desire to become a more dynamic and innovative city
- Students shall be involved in research projects and community service initiatives
- Students should be eager to represent their peers to the Mayor, Chief of Police, and other city leaders

MEMBER SELECTION

- Nomination materials will be sent to each High School's Principal and School Resource Officer(s)

- High Schools within the City of Miramar will be invited to nominate students
- Interested Students are encouraged to request nomination through their High School or to self-nominate
- All students are encouraged to present letters of recommendation from their school and community members, who are not relatives
- The Mayor and Police Chief will review all nominations, conduct interviews, and make final recommendations for participation in the Miramar Youth Advisory Council
- Students and parents/guardians must sign travel, medical and photograph authorization forms

SCHOLARSHIP

- Miramar Youth Advisory Council members will be eligible for a Miramar Youth Advisory Council Scholarship
- Council members will be eligible to receive up a \$1,000.00 scholarship in their senior year
- Council members must participate in the Miramar Youth Advisory Council a minimum of 2 years and be in good standing in their Senior year of High School to be eligible to receive any scholarship monies

COUNCIL MEMBER DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Attend orientation
- Attend the (2) two monthly meetings
- YAC Shirt MUST be worn to school on the days of each scheduled meeting
- Participate in research projects, community service programs, sub-committees, and other city/community events and/or meetings upon request
- Attend a minimum of (2) two City Commission Meetings each year in full dress uniform (2 attend each meeting and rotate to cover all commission meetings)
- Prepare reports and make presentations to the Mayor and Police Chief on the council's activities
- Hold public youth meetings to gather input from constituents
- Coordinate with other local and national youth organizations as necessary
- Select council officers
- Maintain minutes of all meetings noting attendance and issues addressed
- Serve as a role model to other youths
- Show proper respect and exhibit orderly conduct at all meetings and events
- Establish goals, work plans, and budgets to address youth concerns
- Identify issues affecting City of Miramar youth
- Advise the Mayor, Commission, and other city leaders on policy issues related to youth concerns
- Provide resources for youth orientated programs and projects
- Promote public awareness of the strengths and abilities of the city's youth
- Connect teens to services and assist the city with the planning of youth activities
- Adhere to dress code as specified in the Board County School Board guidelines

- City history, organizational structure and administrative processes
- Municipal policy and budget development

ACTIVITIES

- Leadership activities which will provide hands-on leadership development and training; with special emphasis on highlighting the inner-workings of government
- Annual Council Research Project – A research paper written on a relevant topic, chosen by the Mayor and Chief of Police, which explores relevant conceptual, research, and policy issues
- National League of Cities Youth Advocacy Board – Council members will partner with the National League of Cities Youth Advocacy Board (Youthscape, etc.)
- “Inside Government” facilities tours and presentations – Council members will tour various city departments and facilities, and will receive information about their functions and operations in the city
- Service events – Council members will participate in various events, held by the city, which provide assistance and give back to the community (i.e.: holiday tree lighting, ribbon cuttings, Relay for Life etc.)
- Mandatory attendance (on a rotating basis) at all City Commission Meetings as a representative of the YAC
- Mandatory shadowing of a city department (scheduled is coordinated by the students with city department representatives so as not to conflict with school)
