We strive to be a welcoming and relevant Christian community doing what matters through prayer, worship, teaching, outreach, fellowship, and service.

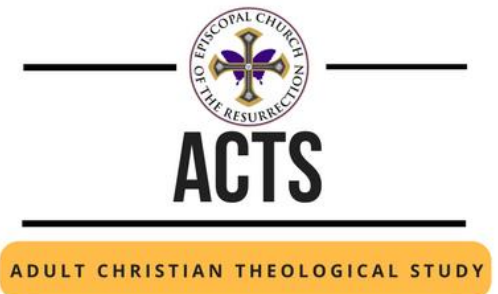
We will demonstrate the real-life application of scripture, tradition and reason by providing a safe place to respond to each other's needs, hurts, joys and interests.

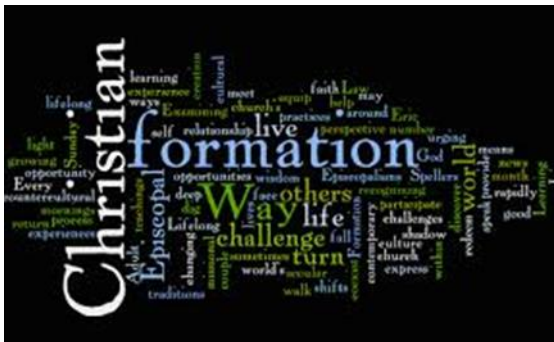

Adult Learners

ACTS is a three-year course where group members set their own learning goals at their own pace, and generally spend two and four hours a week in reading, study and preparation. In the weekly meetings, group members have an opportunity to share insights, discoveries, and discuss the study materials. The group mentor is not the teacher but facilitates the groups study and work. The course reading and study provides academic content, but the focus of the group is centered on a more holistic view of scripture, tradition, and reason that can be applied to a better understanding that life is ministry. The process involves examining a participant's life through the lens of the material being learned and our culture so we may begin to experience the potential that everything that we do is ministry for manifesting the love of Christ.

Course Content

ACTS is a three-year survey of the Christian biblical tradition and church history. First year participants use a text book to survey the Hebrew text known as the Old Testament. Second year participants use a text book to survey the Christian text known as the New Testament, and third year participants use a text book to survey the Christian church history. A supplemental book is used each week to offer addition theological voices on specific ministry themes. Throughout the yearly study, participants will develop a better understanding of biblical interpretation, theology, ethics, spirituality, and worship.

Group Meetings

The weekly group meeting is foundational of the program. The weekly group meets on Wednesdays at 6:00 and begins in September and concludes the first week in May. The meetings follow the White County public school calendar and last approximately one and a half to two hours.



Enrollment and Fees

There is no cost for the course. The only cost is for the purchase of the course text book and supplemental books. Participants enroll for a one-year cycle at a time. A retreat in the winter or spring may be planned.
