Senior Highlight – Phillip and Carol Cato

Phillip and Carol Cato have literally been around the block a time or two. Having met and worked together at Sears, Roebuck and Company in Detroit, Michigan, Phil and Carol married in 1966. Their son, Jason was born a few years later and not long after that, Phil decided he wanted to 'change-up' a bit and live in another country for a while.

The Cato's first choice was to move to Italy where Phil had last served in the U.S. Army as a Radio Communications Teletype Operator, but after receiving a job offer in Canada, the family packed up and moved to Toronto in 1970 only to find that there was no job after all. Carol's family encouraged the Cato's to move back home where they could be closer to their new grandson; however, Carol had faith that the Lord brought them to Canada for a purpose and would provide for them.



And, so He did! Phil was able to acquire a position at T. Eaton Company where he became one of the company's leading National Furniture Buyers and the only person of color to serve in such an elite position. At the same time, Carol began attending and soon graduated from Nursing School. After nine years, the Cato's moved back to Detroit to be closer to family. It was there that Phil not only landed a job with J.L. Hudson Company but climbed the career ladder to become one of the company's leading store managers. Carol worked her way up the healthcare ladder as well, serving as Operating Room Supervisor, a teacher for nursing students, and then a Nurse Recruitment Manager.

The best was yet to come. Phil tells it like this: *"It was after moving back to Detroit that I became a true Christian."* Carol had always been a devout Christian, but not until around 1980 had Phil felt called to serve the Lord. And serve Him he did! Attending a large Baptist Church in Detroit, Phil was ordained as a Deacon of the Church and spent the next 17 years serving as Youth Director. With Carol by his side, the two worked diligently with youth of all ages and backgrounds to provide them vast opportunities to come to know, trust and love the Lord. Phil describes his time of working with the young people as "a very fulfilling time witnessing the joy of young people." Beyond coordinating Friday night Bible studies, college/university tours, basketball events and monitored sleepovers, the Cato's instituted what they refer to as 'The Christian Answer' oratorical contest, where a student was to present and discuss any topic, no matter how controversial – but had to present a resolution with a Christian answer.

Life for the Cato's continued with Carol receiving her second college degree and shifting career once again from nurse recruitment to Regional Recruiter for the U.S. Census Bureau. Likewise, Phil moved from his manager's position and became the overall Manager for a national art supply store where he eventually retired in 2002. Asked if he was an artist, Phil stated, "no, but I was a good manager."

In 2004 Phil confronted his first lung cancer diagnosis. The Cato family's unwavering faith in the healing power of the Lord guided him through both the first and second diagnosis and healings. Referring to Phil as her "Miracle Man" for fighting and defeating the cancer battle, Carol is the first to praise Jesus for His covering and protection over Phil and her family during these difficult times.

Coffee – More Than Your Morning Kick-Start

Did you know that coffee is good for more than a morning power surge?

How about instead of throwing away that last bit of black coffee, you add some extra flavor to a marinade, gravy, sauce or frosting? And speaking of added flavor, did you ever think of adding a couple of tablespoons of freshly ground coffee beans to a cake, cookie or brownie batter (coffee and chocolate together... ummm-good!).

Gardeners might consider adding used coffee grounds as a nitrogen-rich kick-starter to your compost pile. Your plants will love you for it.

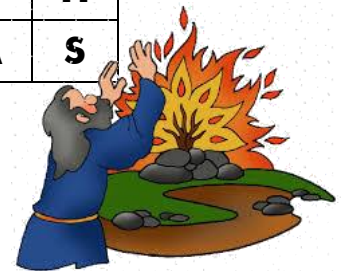
