Happy New Year to the entire SCCS family! I am excited for what the Lord has in store for our school in 2018. I believe He is going to continue blessing us as long as we make Him a priority and continue striving for excellence in the education we provide. I am committed to these two areas as I serve as Interim Head of School and Upper School Principal.

In the New Year, SCCS Families, please be looking for ways to pray as we seek Christ in all we do. I believe that seeking God in prayer is vital. We currently have our Moms in Prayer on a weekly basis, but I hope to see that expanded by getting those prayer requests out to everyone who may not be able to make it to those weekly prayer times. In an effort for strong academics I am developing an academic committee. This committee will evaluate all of our curriculum. Each subject will be put on a rotating schedule so that it is reviewed every five years. This will ensure that we are delivering the best classical education possible. Our first priority is to review our math curriculum.

We are going to strive to strengthen our math program. We will be introducing kindergarten math to pre-school students. Our kindergarten classes will then begin doing first grade math, first grade will do second grade math, and so on. This step to strengthen our math and ready our students for college will take a number of years, but in the long run it is felt that it will strengthen our math test scores which already are above the national average. Any student that is extra strong in math may also test into a higher grade to excel even more.

As mentioned, this change will be gradual, so in the interim there will also be a few other steps taken to strengthen our math. For one, we are planning to offer a pre-calculus course over the summer for students who qualify. Offering this course will hopefully prepare students before taking the ACT or SAT for college entry.
