




Bishop's Visitation this Sunday

The service for the bishop's visitation is open only to those being confirmed, reaffirmed, or received, their sponsors and families, and the vestry. The congregation is invited to join us online to view the livestream of the service. The Bishop has agreed to take questions from the congregation after the service. The Bishop will join us for confirmations and official admission to the Episcopal denomination on Sunday, April 25, St. Mark's Day. Please keep in your prayers our candidates: John and Vicki Levario, Sharon and Ed Muehlbacher, and Jana G. We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.



The Rt. Rev. John Harvey Taylor is the seventh bishop of the six-county Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles. The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Los Angeles encompasses 65,000 Episcopalians in some 135 congregations and ministry centers located in Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, Santa Barbara and Ventura counties. Served by some 400 clergy, the diocese also includes some 40 Episcopal schools and 10 social service and chaplaincy institutions.

A lifelong Episcopalian, Taylor was born in Detroit, Michigan in 1954, the son of journalists and formerly served as chief of staff to former President Richard M. Nixon and later as the executive director of the Nixon Library in Yorba Linda, Calif.

He received a bachelor's degree in political science at the UC San Diego, and an M.Div. at the Claremont School of Theology and Bloy House. He is a graduate of Phillips Academy, Andover, Massachusetts. He was ordained a priest in January 2004 and served as curate at the Church of St. Andrew the Apostle in Fullerton. He was ordained to the episcopate on July 8, 2017. Before his election, Taylor served as vicar of St. John Chrysostom Church and School in Rancho Santa Margarita.

With most high schools and colleges still closed, we are desperately trying to maintain a steady supply of blood while trying to keep our youth donors engaged in the importance of donating.

Donors between the ages of 16-24 will get a \$10 e-gift card for a place they like to eat or shop when they come to donate blood April 1-30. Please help us by recruiting youth donors to come give blood and help save lives! IMPORTANT: Donors must have a valid email address on file to receive their gift card. The need for blood is constant and only volunteer donors can fulfill that need for patients in our community. Nationwide, someone needs a unit of blood every 2 to 3 seconds and most of us will need blood in our lifetime.

St. Mark's began forming this Commission last fall. To date, the Planning Group has prepared Vision and Mission Statements. Page Turners, a twice-monthly book study group, was formed in response to the racial unrest in 2020, including the murder of George Floyd. We began reading *Caste* by Isabel Wilkerson in March. Our next meeting, scheduled for **April 27, from 6:30pm to 8:00pm on Zoom**, will cover through chapter 13. We plan to finish the book by May 25. Our discussion leaders are John and Andrea Flasher. Even if this time is impossible for you, we urge you to read *Caste* on your own. "This is My Story..." is a twice-monthly series to open a conversation about how we have experienced race. Each time, a different parishioner will give her or his autobiographical account. Whether Black, Asian American, another person of color, or someone who has experienced white privilege, each of us has a story to tell. Learning about one another can help us work toward racial justice and equity for all. Our next storyteller will be Dr. Jim Brown, who will share his experience from growing up in a multi-racial family to practicing medicine as a racial minority. He will tell his story during our "coffee hour" time on **Sunday, May 2, from 11:20am to 12:10pm on Zoom**. After hearing his story, you will have a chance to meet with others in a small breakout group to reflect on what you heard. This is not a question-and-answer session with the speaker present, and it is not a discussion of current events involving racial issues. Instead, your participation will remain focused on your own reaction. We hope you will join us as we get to know and understand one another better. St. Mark's Quarterly Financial Update

St. Mark's received donations of \$75,256 for the first quarter of 2021 (January through March), which is \$3,056 above budget. We also received \$9,956 for the Building Fund and \$750 for the endowment. Thank you to all who have given to support our ministry. In 2020, we received a Paycheck Protection Plan (PPP) loan and will be applying for loan forgiveness in the coming months.
