Loving Our Neighbor: Masks Encouraged

Masking is strongly encouraged. Masks are worn by those serving people face-to-face in close proximity—for example, hospitality hosts, ushers, greeters, Sunday School teachers, and Eucharistic ministers. Masks may be removed at the lectern, altar, or presiders' chairs.

The Readings

The Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) is based on a three-year cycle of Sunday Eucharistic readings with Year A focusing on the Gospel of Matthew - The Gospel of John is interspersed through all three years of the lectionary. The Sunday lectionary readings do not cover the whole Bible, but are chosen to highlight the ministry of Jesus Christ and the story of God's people.

There are always questions as to why we have different options for readings on a given Sunday, especially during the Season after Pentecost or Ordinary Time. The RCL has two different tracks of reading. Track 1 provides for a semi-continuous reading of the First (or Old) Testament narratives, which gives a person the opportunity to hear some of the great First Testament stories as well as capture some of the story in a different way. It also has the inclusion of women and their role in salvation history, giving us texts that have not been heard on Sunday before - Genesis through Judges in year A.
