Be there to tell us about your first or favorite decade so far. Then help us try to envision the St. Mark's that will be in 2023 and into the future.

## **WORSHIP**

### **The Great Litany: The First Sunday in Lent, February 26**

The Great Litany is spoken at 8 AM and sung at the beginning of the 10 AM service on the first Sunday in Lent. The Great Litany (BCP, pages 148–154) is an extended intercessory prayer, which includes various petitions read by a leader with responses voiced by the congregation. Because of its penitential tone, it is especially appropriate during Lent. Music found in the blue hymnal, Hymn S-67. The "S" (or service music) hymns are in the front portion of the hymnal.

### **Confirmation with the Bishop, December 10, 2023**

St. Mark's will have a bishop's visit on Sunday, December 10, 2023, at the 10AM service.

This is the office visit from the office of the bishop and a time for confirming those previously baptized, receiving Christians from other denominators, and reaffirming baptismal vows. ### **Music Director Search Committee Update**

The leading candidate has withdrawn his application for the position of Music Director and Organist, so the committee is reviewing additional applications and plans to conduct further interviews in the next few weeks. We will continue to keep the congregation informed about our progress toward finding the person God has in mind for our music ministry at St. Mark's.

### **Offertory Plates Return to Circulation, March 5**

Beginning Sunday, March 5, ushers will resume using the offertory plates to collect contributions in the sanctuary. Please note that hand sanitizer is readily available to use before receiving communion.

### **Loving Our Neighbor: Masking**

Masking is strongly encouraged. Masks are worn by those serving people face-to-face in close proximity—for example, hospitality hosts, ushers, greeters, Sunday School teachers, and Eucharistic ministers. Masks may be removed at the lectern, altar, or presiders' chairs. Unvaccinated persons and those who are immunocompromised are especially encouraged to wear masks indoors, particularly when in a small room with minimal air circulation.

### **Partnering with the Kaleidoscope Institute to Envision Our Future**

Rev. Keith and your Vestry members are partnering with the Kaleidoscope Institute to help us plan for St. Mark's ministries in 2023 and into the future. Some are familiar with the book *The Wolf Shall Dwell with the Lamb* by Rev. Dr. Eric Law and his work which began in the Los Angeles Diocese in the 1980s to model effective leadership in diverse faith communities. The Kaleidoscope Institute grew out of that, and now its curriculum and associates help parishes and organizations of all sizes to grow and thrive, especially through difficult times of change.

Following the February 26 "Bridging" session, a St. Mark's leadership team will continue to work with the KI curriculum and facilitators throughout the year at Vestry meetings and four additional study sessions. In October, we hope to have a big event to launch and celebrate our new ministry model at St. Mark's, which we hope will include things like our revived music and newcomer programs, special events hosting on our campus, the Head Start Preschool, and other new ministries for our community.
