**Health update for Presiding Bishop Michael Curry**

Throughout the month of June, Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop Michael Curry received [further testing and monitoring](#) following a [Memorial Day weekend hospitalization](#) for internal bleeding and heart arrhythmia.

Under the care of a cardiologist and an endocrinologist, Bishop Curry has followed orders to rest, and his medical team continues to closely monitor and treat his atrial fibrillation as well as an [aortic aneurysm](#) discovered June 16 during a transesophageal echocardiogram with cardioversion. His doctors are also conducting a variety of tests to diagnose and treat the cause of the original internal bleed. [Read more...](#)
