Remembering St. Valentine

This Sunday, let us remember Valentine, a doctor in Rome in the third century. He used herbs and flowers to make medicines to help the people living in the poorer areas of Rome. In secret, he was a Christian minister, conducting house worship, performing marriages, and sharing the message of God's love for everyone. He is noted for curing a young child of blindness with one of his herbal medicines. He was arrested and killed in the year 269, when the Emperor Claudius II ordered the persecution of the Christians.

HEALTH & COMMUNITY PROTOCOLS FOR WORSHIP

Those 12 years and older show proof of vaccination; those two years and up wear a mask.
Those 12 years and up who are unvaccinated join us online for in-spirit worship.

Please consider getting the booster and social distancing. We will be singing less but still having music, be meeting outside for hospitality/coffee hour but still having socially distanced refreshments and be avoiding large in-person sit-down meals but still be church and community for one another and the world.

St. Mark's cares for the young, elderly, and immuno-compromised. Vaccinations are essential to creating a safer and healthier workplace and worship space for all—including employees, volunteers, guests, and especially for children, elderly, and the vulnerable. Our health and strength are intertwined with one another. Health is not an individual endeavor.

Masks: Worn at all times by those 2 years and up. We strongly recommend the use of disposable (surgical/medical/paper) face masks. Cloth masks should have a filter or disposable paper mask underneath. Please avoid single-layer cloth masks with gaps, valves, vents, or other openings.

Social Distancing: We are respectful of those around us and adjust as able for healthy spaces between households. We appreciate everyone's patience and flexibility. Direct physical contact with young children is avoided; elbow bumps are fine, but no hugs or handshakes.

Exchanging "The Peace": Everyone's space and sensitivities are respected. When someone offers their elbow, fist, or a peace sign, we respond appropriately.

Restrooms: If it can wait, only one person or household uses the restroom at a time.

Hospitality: To reduce multiple handling of shared objects such as the coffee urn, hot water dispenser, and serving utensils, we let the hospitality host serve us. For now, we are outside.

An Invitation to Host a Sunday in Lent for the Newcomer Class

The Lent program will have two components: a lecture and discussion between Sunday services and a practicum following the 10AM service. Samples include a tour of the Sacristy hosted by the Altar Guild who explain the vestments, vessels, and linens; tour of the choir loft and a handbell lesson by the music department; a tour of the memorial garden by the 1910 Legacy Society featuring a workshop on POLST forms; and an open house of the Sunday School rooms (including the chapel) with all the manipulatives out with docents in each room to explain the programs.

Think engaging, interactive, relevant, and passionate. Handouts for later reference with contact information is encouraged. Think about what you want the participant to do, be, think, know, or feel afterwards. Are you hoping that they join your group or recruit others? Think about how you plan to follow up or equip them to take the next step. Consider a video running in the conference room for a multi-media presentation. Also have a wish list to encourage a sense of partnership/sponsorship/ownership of the program.
