## Our Preachers for June 18

**Marcia Godwin**, PhD, is a professor of Public Administration at the University of La Verne, teaching in the master and doctoral programs. She has also served as Master of Public Administration Director, Institutional Review Board Director, and in leadership positions in faculty governance. Her research and teaching interests include public engagement, local government, participatory budgeting, and public policy. She also provides commentary on California politics and local government issues to regional and national media. She previously worked in local government administration, including with the Cities of Chino and Rancho Cucamonga. She is a vestry member, serves as Finance Committee Chair, and has assisted with the music program.

**Karin Brown**, PhD, is the Dean of Graduate Studies and Associate Vice President of Cal State LA. Prior to this appointment, she served as the Associate Dean of Graduate Studies and Research for three years, Director of the School of Social Work at Cal State LA for five years, Director of the BA in Social Work program for six years, and as a faculty member in the School of Social Work for 15 years. She has over 25 years of experience within the field of social work as an educator and practitioner. Her

practice experience has been in public child welfare and medical social work. She is a member of the Vestry and works with Vestry recruiting, training, and development.

### **Loving Our Neighbor: Masks Encouraged**

Masking is strongly encouraged. Masks are worn by those serving people face-to-face in close proximity—for example, hospitality hosts, ushers, greeters, Sunday School teachers, and Eucharistic ministers. Masks may be removed at the lectern, altar, or presiders' chairs.

### **Enriching Our Worship**

"[The *Enriching Our Worship* series offered by the Standing Liturgical Commission to the Church through the General Convention] is part of an ongoing process of listening to what the Spirit is saying to the Church through the diverse experience of those who gather to worship and to celebrate the sacramental rites which fashion and identify us as the People of God... One of the considerations in choosing or developing the texts...has been the prayer experience of women, and the desire to honor that experience while remaining faithful to the constituent elements and norms of liturgical prayer as this Church has received and understood them." Bishop Frank T. Griswold, former Presiding Bishop, from the "Preface" of *Enriching Our Worship* 1, 1998.

From this listening process, a person will notice the following in our worship: "the one" in the *Sanctus*; "human" in the Nicene Creed; and removal of the *filioque* clause "and the Son" from the Nicene Creed (and all new liturgies).

### **What Questions Do You Have about Sunday Worship? An Instructed Eucharist**

The Eucharist, also known as Holy Communion, is central to our worship and faith. However, many of us may have questions about the significance and meaning behind the different elements and actions. To foster a deeper understanding and appreciation for the Eucharist, we invite you to submit any questions you have about our Sunday Worship for an Instructed Eucharist on August 27 and September 3. No question is too simple.

### **Praying for the Bishops Assisting in the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles**

Our Bishop Diocesan, the Rt. Rev. John Harvey Taylor, has called three Bishops Assisting to help with visitations: Bishop Frank Brookhart, Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori, and Bishop Ed Little. A bishop assisting is a former diocesan bishop and serves under the direction of the diocesan bishop. Bishop Brookhart will preach, celebrate, and confirm at St. Mark's on Sunday, December 10, 2023. We are including them in our Sunday prayers by first name.
