Because St. Mark's cares for the young, elderly, and immuno-compromised, because vaccinations are essential to creating a safer/healthier workplace and worship space, because our health and strength are intertwined with one another, and because health is not an individual endeavor, those 12 years and up show proof of vaccination and those ages 2 years and up wear masks for in-the-building services. Masks may be taken off at the pulpit, altar, or presider chairs when reading - not singing. We have disposable face masks for your use. We are respectful of those around us and adjust for healthy spaces between households. Direct physical contact with young children is avoided; elbow bumps are fine, but no hugs or handshakes. Tried something brand new: For Lent and Eastertide, we are experimenting with A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church by Dr. Wilda C. Gafney, a Hebrew Biblical scholar and Episcopal priest, which is inclusive of the lives and perspectives of women and offers a fresh perspective on the names and divine titles for God in the Psalms translations. We will return to the BCP version of the Psalter for the season after Pentecost Day (Ordinary time).

Deanery, Diocese, & National Church offerings included (but not limited to) "Jesus De/Constructed" by Diana Butler Bass; "The Lenten Virtual Borderlands Experience" by the Office of Latino/Hispanic Ministries and Episcopal Migration Ministries; "Loving Our Neighbor Lent Program: Growing Beloved Community" using the Church Next video series based on Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's initiative and a collaboration with St. George's Episcopal Church in Laguna Hills; and the various Deanery 6 Collaborations including the Enneagram Quiet Day and Book Study Series, Shrove Tuesday, Tenebrae, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil with hosts St. Ambrose Claremont, St. John's LaVerne, Christ Church Ontario, and St. Paul's Pomona.

The creativity of old things in new ways: Shrove Sunday featuring the flint/stone fire transforming Palms to Ashes, the Bonfire of Disappointment, and delicious s'mores. To invite/increase engagement and participation we have added Readers (in addition to lectors) and Crucifers in new ways.

And the welcome return of things: In-person in-the-building Ash Wednesday Services plus the 5th presentation of Ash and Dash (Drive-through ashes); "Taking Sabbath Time in Lent" Quiet Day; "Walk in Love" Lent Program for Newcomers (phase two will be during Eastertide); Lenten Wilderness Walk Experiences at Rancho Santa Ana Botanic Garden in Claremont and Joshua Tree; in-person, in-the-building Holy Week Services including anointing of hands, Taizé Tenebrae, foot washing, stripping of the altar, all-night prayer vigil in the Garden of Gethsemane decorated Chapel of Repose, and Stations of the Cross.

We joined the world on Ash Wednesday in the Global Day of Prayer and Fasting for Peace in Ukraine. Prayers for peace continue. And St. Mark's might be developing a reputation for curbside ministries. From Ash & Dash came Curbside Christmas. At least one vehicle came through to pick up a palm in what may develop into a "Palms in Palms" curbside ministry next year (h/t Lisa Drew).

Building Fund Update: Donating for an Actual Rainy Day

We are planning a burn-the-mortgage celebration when our building loan becomes due, thanks in large part to a generous, anonymous donation. The Building Fund will continue in order to pay for facility needs. We literally need rainy day funds! We have experienced new leaks with each shower, however small. These mainly are mainly flat-roof sections where the roofing has worn out. Please consider donating to the Building Fund as well as to our regular church coffers for this and other projects. You'll be glad when it will no longer rain on our parade...or the acoustical ceiling tiles. Thank you!

Building Loan Update

As reported to the congregation at the January 30 annual meeting, the Vestry has been considering whether to pay off or attempt to refinance the approximately \$325,000 that will be due when our building loan expires this May. The 2012 loan was originally \$930,000 for school and church improvements and was refinanced in 2017.

The Vestry, at its February 27 meeting, unanimously approved paying off the loan. A generous anonymous donation allowed us to pay down the principal enough to be able to consider this action; we will eliminate \$85,000 per year in loan payments. We are planning a "burn the mortgage" celebration this spring after we have made arrangements for the final payment. We appreciate everyone who has donated and continues to donate to the building fund so that we can meet our facility needs. --Finance Committee

Program includes the unique ways our Anglican tradition provides resources for us in uncertain times, a consideration of exile using Psalm 137, and the formative power of our rituals as we renegotiate our familiar spaces and liturgies.

The last time Easter fell on April 17 the following happened the same year: The "Flintstones" premieres on television. "The Magnificent Seven" and "Psycho" open in movie theaters. The US sends the first troops to Vietnam. Xerox introduces the first photocopier. Kennedy and Nixon take part in the first televised presidential debate. "To Kill a Mockingbird" by Harper Lee is published. Chubby Checker and the Twist start a dance craze. Future Justice Thurgood Marshall argues the Boynton v. Virginia case before the Supreme Court that racial segregation in public transportation was unconstitutional. And President Eisenhower signs the Civil Rights Act of 1960 into law. The next year Easter falls on April 17 – 2033.
