Sign-Up To Join The Maundy Thursday Vigil

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray.' He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be grieved and agitated. Then he said to them, 'I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me. (Matthew 26:36-38)

On **Thursday, April 6**, we keep vigil with Jesus throughout the night at the altar of repose in the chapel. It is a time for personal devotion and prayer. Sign up for a one-hour shift (or more) as an individual, a couple, or as a family. Shifts overlap and there should always be at least two persons present in the chapel. There will always be two men of the parish about the grounds to insure the safety of the participants. Those participating in the Vigil will receive a text or email reminder on Tuesday, April 4, listing the time chosen and the name and contact information of the person they are relieving and the person relieving them. Vigil participants are asked to park in the front of the church, to enter through the north doors and proceed directly to the chapel. For additional information, speak to Karin Brown.

Loving Our Neighbor: Masking

Masking is strongly encouraged. Masks are worn by those serving people face-to-face in close proximity—for example, hospitality hosts, ushers, greeters, Sunday School teachers, and Eucharistic ministers. Masks may be removed at the lectern, altar, or presiders' chairs.

A Day in the Wilderness - Joshua Tree, Saturday, March 25

Things to do? Walk, hike, read, meditate, scramble on the boulders, take photos, draw or paint pictures, relax. We might be getting into wildflower season?

Meet at St. Mark's lower parking lot at 7:30 AM, Saturday, March 25 to set up carpools and depart by 8:00 AM. Driving directions will be provided. It's about a two-hour drive including a rest stop at the Whitewater Rest Area on the way. Note that cell phones may not work reliably after leaving Highway 62 and entering the Park.

Sturdy pants, shoes, hats and layered clothes are a good idea as temperatures can be mild to brisk. Sun protection is needed. Please bring folding chairs. Picnic tables are limited. Bring water or other beverages, snacks and lunch. Consider participating in an informal pot-luck. (If enough interest, we may do soup or chili/chili dogs or something similar.) Water, food and other supplies are not available in the park. The restrooms are basic. Handi-wipes might be welcome. No pets please. The park interior is not wheelchair friendly.

Families, carpools, etc., can plan on returning on their own schedule as needed.
