Epiphany Music Notes Service Music, Part 2 Music for the "Ordinary" of the Eucharist

In the front of the hymnal, settings of music for the Eucharist begin at S-76 and include just about everything that can possibly be sung in the service. A complete history of the evolution of the Ordinary of the Eucharist (the texts that are repeated each Sunday) has filled books, but the short version is that the Latin (or in the case of the Kyrie, Greek) texts for the Gloria (Glory to God), Kyrie (Lord, Have Mercy), Sanctus (Holy Lord), Benedictus (Blessed is the One), and Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) go back at least as far as the fifth century, some as far as the third. Beginning with plainsong, like the setting we used for our Ordinary during Advent and will again in Lent, we have written notation for mass settings by composers great and small from every musical period and from most types of world music. They originate from the Catholic, Orthodox, and Coptic traditions, and later include the Lutheran and Anglican traditions as well. Some are meant to be sung by a congregation, some

by a choir with instrumentalists and soloists on behalf of the congregation, and some by both together. Choose your favorite musical period or style, and listen to these beautiful examples on a very incomplete list, a VERY TINY sample of what can be explored:

Early Renaissance: Missa Pange Lingua by Josquin des Prez, early 1500s

Renaissance/Tudor: Four-part Mass by William Byrd, 1592/3
Baroque: Mass in B-minor by Johann Sebastian Bach, 1749
Classical: Coronation Mass by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, 1779
Romantic: Petite Messe Solennelle By Gioachino Rossini, 1863

Late Romantic/Early Modern: Mass in G minor by Ralph Vaughan Williams, 1921

Modern: Mass by Igor Stravinsky, 1948

Acid Rock: Mass in F minor by the Electric Prunes, 1968 (yes, I owned this album!)

Jazz: At Grace Cathedral by Vince Guaraldi, 1965 Congolese: Missa Luba by Guido Haazen, 1958 Argentine: Missa Criola by Ariel Ramirez, 1964

Celtic/Folk: Black Mountain Liturgy by Sally Ann Morris, 2005

Praise: Mass of Creation by Marty Haugen, 2010 Chinese: Mass by Si-Yan Tang, ?early 2000s

Contemporary Scandinavian: Sunrise Mass by Ola Gjello, 2012

Hearing this music can make us feel connected to the millions of people around the world and throughout history who, listening to and participating with the same texts and music we use at St. Mark's, have gathered at the altar at God's invitation and received the sacraments.

Celebrating the Feast Day of Li Tim-Oi

This Sunday, St. Mark's joins the diocese in the celebration of the feast day of Li Tim-Oi, the first woman ordained in the Anglican Communion. The weekend includes an art show featuring women in the Bible, panel discussion featuring the first woman Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church Katharine Jefferts Schori, Chinese Lion Dance, and a festive Chinese banquet - see here for more information and to register. On Sunday at St. Mark's, Canon Serena Beeks will be our preacher and the Rev. Sally Monastiere will preside at the Holy Eucharist.

The Rev. Dr. Florence Li Tim-Oi

May 5, 1907 - February 26, 1992

Florence Li Tim-Oi was the very first Anglican woman priest. She was ordained to the priesthood in Hong Kong Cathedral by Bishop Ronald Hall in 1944, as an emergency measure following the Japanese invasion of China.

In January 1984, Li Tim-Oi was honored at Westminster Abbey on the 40th anniversary of her ordination. During that visit she was invited to Lambeth Palace to meet Archbishop Robert Runcie, who had remained unconvinced as to whether women should be ordained. After meeting

her, he told the Canadian Archbishop Ted Scott, "Who am I to say whom God can or cannot call?" 'It Takes ONE Woman' to change the thinking of the Church."



Zelle is here! New option for online giving to St. Mark's

Zelle is a convenient, no-fee way to directly give to St. Mark's. Zelle is a collaborative effort by banks to allow customers to directly transfer funds without a wait and without the fees charged by vendors like PayPal. You can set up Zelle once you log into your bank account. There also is a mobile application, although we recommend making sure that password protection and other security features are enabled. St. Mark's donations can be made by using <code>give@stmarks-upland.org</code>. Donations will go directly to the operating fund to pay for our regular costs (including our nice air conditioning) unless you designate otherwise.

How to Give Stocks or Mutual Fund Shares to St. Mark's

We have a brokerage account through Charles Schwab to accept stock and mutual fund gifts to St. Mark's. Donors are not assessed capital gains if the stock is transferred to St. Mark's. You will also need to let us know the amount and type of donation so that we can appropriately track the donation. Our policy is to sell any stock upon receipt. Donations completed before December 31 will count as 2023 donations. Donations beginning in January will count toward 2024.
