Centering Prayer & Music to Start the 10 AM Service

Centering prayer is a method of Christian prayer which enhances a person's relationship with God. Through centering prayer a person can experience God's presence within, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to deepen that relationship.

1. Choose a sacred word as the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within – for example, peace, grace, love.
2. Sit comfortably, be aware of your breathing, and close your eyes or soften your gaze.
3. Bring forward the sacred word.
4. When engaged with your thoughts, return ever-so-gently to the sacred word.
5. Close with a silent "Amen."

Music will be played during this time. The gathered community is invited to be still. And the entrance hymn will follow after a brief pause. All preceded by the opening welcome.

Prayer Cross

Jesus said, "Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple."

The Easter Flowering Cross will be available to receive prayers. This tool for prayer echoes the Western Wall in the Holy Land where over 100,000 people visit daily. Prayer is responding to God, by thought and by deeds, with or without words. The prayer cross involves images, words, and the form of the cross to help focus our intention and prayers toward Jesus' way of love. Write or draw your prayers and roll and insert them in the openings or attach them with the provided clips. When more room is needed and when the prayer cross season is finished, prayers will be removed and

reverently burned. They will not be read when collected, however, please be aware that these prayers are not confidential. Please feel free to experiment with the prayer cross as part of your weekly prayer practice.

New Covid Policy beginning Sept 25

Beginning Sept 25, masks will be strongly encouraged. That is, masks will no longer be required for those 2 and up. Masks will continue to be worn by those serving people face-to-face in close proximity - for example, hospitality, ushers, greeters, Sunday School teachers, and Eucharistic ministers. Masks may be taken off at the lectern, altar, or presider chairs. Unvaccinated persons and those immunocompromised are especially encouraged to wear masks indoors - particularly when in a small room with minimal air circulation.

Remembering Heber Becker

Heber was born in Bloomsburg, and raised in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. He earned his undergraduate degree at Franklin and Marshall College in Pennsylvania and his MD from the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. He did his internship at Geisinger Medical Center in Danville, Pennsylvania, and his psychiatric residency at New York Hospital- Cornell University School of Medicine, and was a Clinical Instructor in Psychiatry at the University of Rochester School of Medicine. In between, he became a lieutenant commander in the Navy assigned to the Naval Hospital in Philadelphia. This was followed by ten years in solo practice. Looking for a group practice, he joined the Kaiser Hospital in Fontana in 1979 and moved with his wife, son and two daughters to Upland, California.

Heber retired in 1997 and enjoyed traveling, playing bridge and watching movies. He also enjoyed exploring different ethnic foods, and especially loved sushi. He and his wife were active for many years at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Upland. When asked what he is most proud of, he replied, his three children and eight grandchildren.

Rummage Fundrive Update on Rules

Let's remember that the purpose of this fundraiser is to raise enough money to buy a new refrigerator/freezer for the kitchen.

The Company rules are:

1. Use the TALL white kitchen plastic bags only for clothing and household textiles items, NOT the black garbage bags.
2. For the small household goods, use medium boxes that can be closed.
3. Detail items list is on the Fundrive flyer located in the Narthex and Parish Hall.
4. Please also remember that clothing has to be clean and still wearable. Please DO NOT drop off items that smell, are torn, and dirty. Also, no undergarments.

5. The company will NOT accept any LARGE items such as chairs, couches etc. The items must be able to fit in the containers listed in lines one and two.

Finances and Contribution Update

St. Mark's church income was \$155,851.82 and expenses were \$253,475.28, for a deficit of \$97,623.46 for the period of January 1 through July 31, 2022. We had a cushion at the beginning of the year due to our 2021 PPP loan and are working to reduce expenses. The building fund received donations of \$13,075, not including a previous anonymous donation that helped us to pay off the building loan in June. We are in the midst of the summer season when donations typically dip but expenses do not! Please prayerfully consider your donations to St. Mark's. We need your pledges and donations!
