





Creation Care

Climate and environment bills in the State Legislature

A pair of bills aim to address transparency around corporate emissions. One bill, SB 253, requires companies in California making more than \$1 billion annually to report their emissions. The other, SB 261, requires companies making more than \$500 million annually to report financial risks related to climate change. Lawmakers

approved both.

AB 631 (Hart): Community Safety and Protection Act

Spills, leaks air pollution, and contaminated water sources are just some of the public health problems posed by oil and gas operations. AB 631 holds them accountable: *Passed the legislature, now onto the governor's desk!*

SB 49 – Putting solar along highways and over parking lots can provide gigawatts of clean energy that can help the state build the needed capacity to reach our renewable energy future. – *going to Governor's desk.*

SB 674 would have built on existing law requiring community air monitoring systems to be installed near petroleum refineries that meet certain requirements. The bill would have expanded on the areas in which these air monitoring systems must be installed, including areas around refineries that are transitioning to producing biofuels. It also would have required that the data gathered by these systems be made more easily accessible to the public. The bill did not get the necessary votes to move to the governor's desk by the Legislature's deadline.



Outreach

Support Foothill Family Shelter Thanksgiving Baskets Donation

The Daughters of the King are coordinating St. Mark's donations to Thanksgiving baskets for families in the Foothill Family Shelter program as well as needy families throughout our region. Last year area churches and civic organizations provided enough baskets to serve over 1,000 families. The need is even greater this year. The needed items are listed in the attached flier. You can help by:

- Bringing your completed basket to the narthex or church office by Sunday, November 5, and the Daughters will transport it to the FFS office for you.
- Using the clipboards in the Parish Hall to sign up for items that you will bring to help fill a basket. Bring your items by Sunday, November 5, and leave them in the baskets in the narthex set aside for FFS collections. The Daughters of the King will purchase any missing items, make complete baskets and transport them to the FFS office.
- Donating \$25 grocery gift cards for the purchase of a turkey. For security, enclose these in an envelope marked FFS Thanksgiving and put them in the offering plate.
- Donating money to the drive by writing a check made out to St. Mark's Episcopal Church and writing FFS Thanksgiving in the memo line. \$50 will buy a complete basket, but all donations will help. St. Mark's will send one check to FFS by November 8.

If you prefer to mail your check directly to the Foothill Family Shelter office or take your completed basket to the office yourself, the instructions for doing so are on the flier. Thank you for your help!



Holy Currencies

Holy Currencies only have value when flowing. Share them, don't bury them. A community/ministry is sustainable and missional when all six currencies are flowing. We need one another; no one does it alone.

With the Holy Currency posters please add your post-it response: What **examples** have you seen from others? What helpful **suggestions** and **gifts** do you have to share?



The currency of **Time and Place** takes into consideration use of physical space, as well as the ways communities prioritize staff and volunteer time.

The currency of **Gracious Leadership** invites leaders to practice leadership characterized by compassion, empowerment, community, and innovation. Looking to Jesus as a model, Law writes, "Gracious leadership is not about holding power over others; it is about knowing how to empower others."

The currency of **Relationship** encourages congregations to engage both their internal and external networks.

The currency of **Truth** guides communities into a space of authentic and sometimes difficult perspective sharing and truth-telling. This currency unleashes the power of respectful conversation around divisive issues, revisiting historical narratives, or seeking to understand how ministries might better support those on the margins.

The currency of **Wellness** illuminates the importance of caring for all dimensions of community health. Observing Sabbath, creating community covenants, and tending to economic wellness and justice, sustainability, and social/community wellness are all crucial to the overall health of the community and ministry.

Finally, the currency of **Money** flows from and back into each of the above currencies.

Update on Library Building Repairs

We'd like everyone to know the status of repairs to our Library Building. As many of you may know, the two classrooms and storage room on the ground floor of the building adjacent to the parking lot have suffered water damage over the years and especially last winter. Water seeped through the outer block walls, damaging the carpet and drywall in room 29 and the storage room.

We contracted with a professional restoration company to inspect these areas. This company determined that there is a small amount of a commonly occurring non-toxic soil mold that can create a musty or earthy smell, and its presence is within an acceptable safe range that can be cleaned up. That is good news! However, the Vestry and Buildings & Grounds Committee are concerned about doing extensive repairs inside the lower classrooms before identifying and dealing with the causes of the leakage. Considering the forecast of another wet winter for our area, we might continue to have water leaking into this building. We will be obtaining quotes from water intrusion specialists that can fully identify the drainage issues and scope of the needed work. We wish to permanently solve the problem, but also recognize that we do not have the funds at this time for the

excavation, drainage, and sealing work that is likely to be needed.

This report was presented to the Vestry in September. The Vestry approved the following plan: 1) remove damaged drywall in Room 29, 2) remove the broken handicap ramp outside the library, and 3) consider using sandbags to direct rainwater from around the library down to the parking lot.
