Page Turners: Reflections on the Book and Discussion Caste by Isabel Wilkerson

Red Cross Blood Drive at St. Mark's

Our next blood to be held at St. Mark's on **Friday, July 9, Friday from 8am to 2pm** in the parish hall.

Make your appointment at [Red Cross](#). If you receive a COVID-19 vaccine, knowing the name of the manufacturer is critical in determining your blood donation eligibility. In most cases, there is no deferral time if you receive a vaccine.

The American Red Cross is testing all blood donations for COVID-19 antibodies. These results may provide valuable insight into a donor's potential past exposure to this coronavirus, or an antibody response developed after receiving a COVID-19 vaccine. Only those feeling healthy and well should present to donate and appointments are strongly encouraged. Test results will be available to donors via the American Red Cross Blood Donor App or at RedCrossBlood.org within one to two weeks.

St. Mark's Financial and PPP Loan Update

Thank you for your continued generosity! Regular donations continue to be steady, which has greatly helped St. Mark's to pay its expenses and prepare for the safe return of in-person activities. We also received \$4,585 in Easter offerings through the end of April, which is 50% more than last year. We have benefited from Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans as well. This is a federal program for pandemic relief for small businesses, including faith-based organizations. We are preparing the forgiveness application for the 2020 loan of \$383,937 that largely went to school expenses. It will take several months to receive a determination. We received a second forgivable loan of \$238,400 during the third week of May. It will be used to pay for church and preschool salaries, utilities, and building loan interest for a 24-week period. This loan will allow us to close budget deficits and plan for the future. On behalf of the Finance and Stewardship Committees, we will continue to provide regular updates to the congregation on our finances and loan status.
