Are facial coverings/masks required?

Effective May 8th, face coverings/masks are not required in Riverside County; however, are strongly recommended whenever practical and within reason. Please have a face covering/mask accessible as certain businesses may require them to be worn.

What about physical distancing?

In summary, all City parks and trails have remained opened through this pandemic allowing walking, jogging, hiking, bicycling, or other outdoor activities. Playground equipment, community pool, splash pads, picnic areas and other fixed amenities remain closed per State of California Public Health guidelines.

Which businesses can re-open?

Statewide, all individuals and businesses fall under the direction of the State of California's Stay at Home Order / Public Health Order, which can be found online here:

Effective May 8th, Governor Newsom moved Californians and businesses into "Phase 1 of Stage 2 of the [Resilience Roadmap](#)" developed by the State of California. This means that in addition to businesses deemed by the State of California as [essential businesses](#), curbside and delivery retail is also allowed along with the related supply chain and logistics needed to support it. The State [issued guidance](#) to help these workplaces re-open safely.

Can the City of Temecula allow businesses to re-open in Temecula that are not allowed to be opened by the State of California?

The City of Temecula does not have the authority to override the State of California by re-opening businesses that are currently closed by State orders. The State of California determines which businesses are a part of the "essential" workforce and/or part of each stage of re-opening. Although the City is proactively lobbying on behalf of Temecula Valley to safely and responsibly re-open our local economy, the decision is made by the State of California.

Where can an existing business seek professional advice about available resources or best steps to get through the COVID-19 pandemic?

The City is providing the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) additional office space within its business incubator and resource center known as the Temecula Valley Entrepreneur's Exchange or TVE², which is located within Temecula's former City Hall at

43200 Business Park Drive. The extra office space allows SBDC to expand its one-on-one consulting services for existing businesses who have experienced supply chain disruptions, staffing challenges, a decrease in gross receipts or customers, a temporary closure, or other impacts as a result of COVID-19. These free business consulting services are available now and will continue through this pandemic, and beyond. Business owners can get guidance and advice from industry experts on a multitude of topics including finance, human resource/staffing laws, disaster/contingency planning and more.
