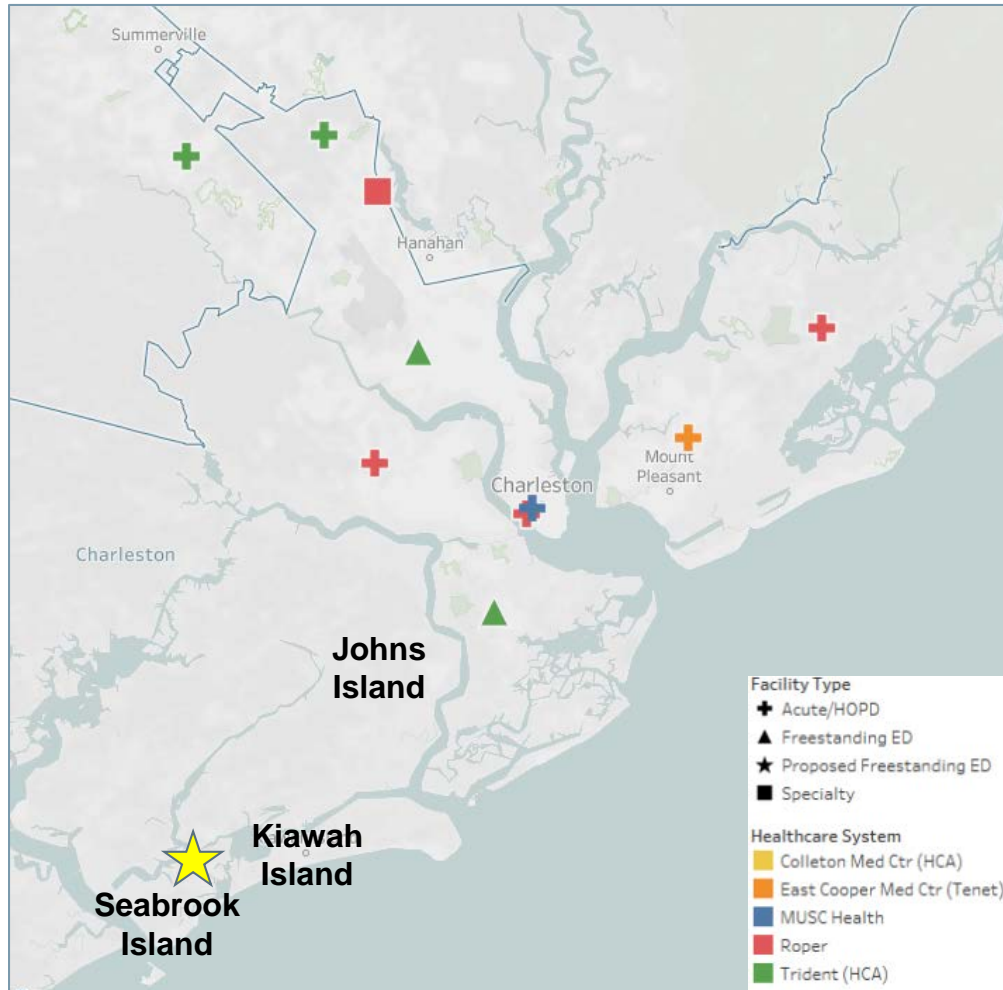


Why new Medical Services in the Sea Islands?

- Every year life is lost or significantly compromised as a result of medical assistance not being readily available in the Sea Islands (time to treatment is key)
- Kiawah and Seabrook property owners with medical issues continue to leave the community to be closer to medical services in the event of an emergency.
- The Sea Islands communities continues to experience rapid residential growth
- Tourist season brings visitors who do not have the local knowledge and awareness to navigate healthcare services in the Charleston area



Community Need

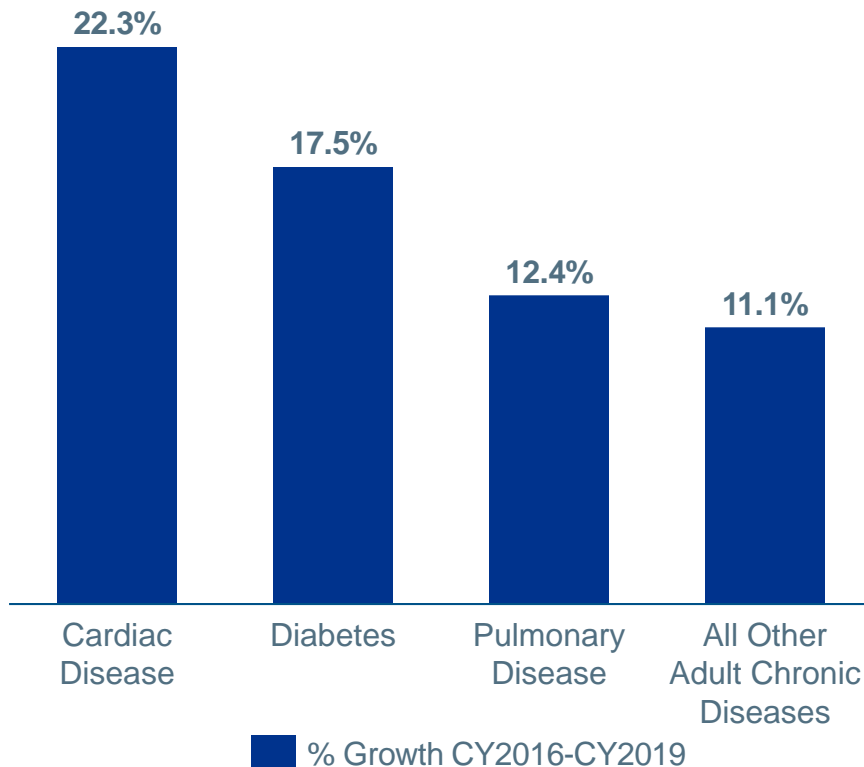


- There are currently no acute, emergent healthcare options in the area.
- The Sea Islands are geographically isolated.
- Double digit population growth is anticipated over the next 5 years.
- Growth of emergency department utilization in this market outpaced the population growth.
- Ease of access for the tourist and part-time resident population who lack established medical care in the area.



Sea Islands Health Stats

Adult Chronic Disease Growth 2016-2019 for Sea Islands



- Emergency Department (ED) visits for adult Sea Island residents resulting in inpatient admission have increased by 16.6% (+497 ED visits) from 2016-2019
- The volume of adult ED visits for chronic diseases has increased 13.4% from 2016-2019
- Total trauma transports to MUSC Med Ctr have increased by 76.1% for Sea Island residents from 2016-2019

Our goal: Improve the quality and timely access to medical services for the Sea Islands communities



This will be accomplished by:

1. Providing immediate access to emergency services;
2. Expanding primary care services;
3. Increasing specialty care services;
4. Enhancing specialty care with robust telemedicine capabilities;
5. Providing access to imaging services; and
6. *Partnering with the community to instill engagement and support.*

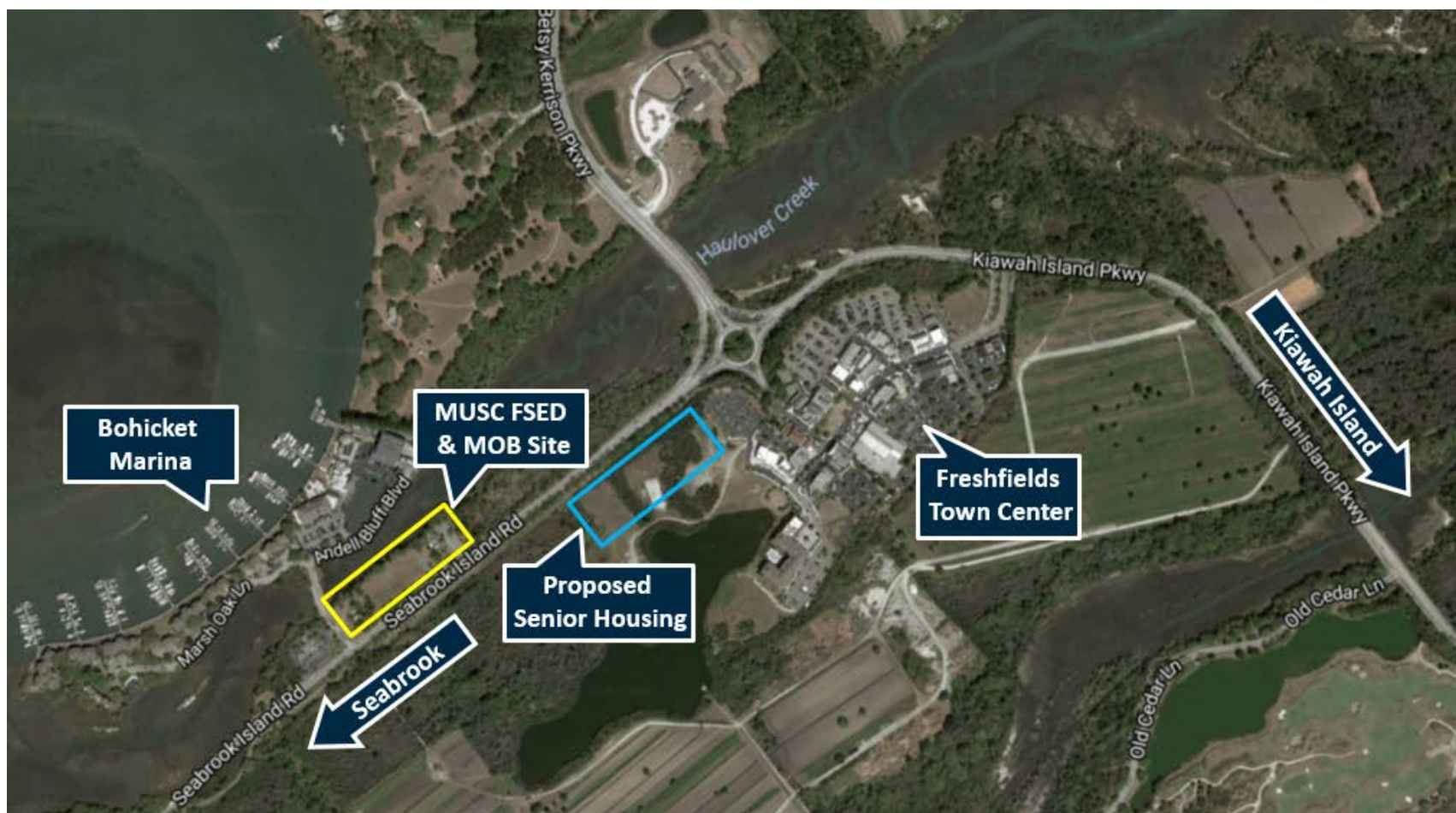
