Targeting E-Bikes

We have been cracking down on illegal ebike use through targeted operations, patrols and seizures.

Examples of recent work:

- Increased visibility in hotspot areas to reassure the public and disrupt any potential crime such as phone snatchers, illegal e-bike riders, and anti-social behaviour before it occurs.
- Increasing patrols in Lake Farm Country Park due to issues at the bike track.
- Carried out community sessions to explain the law, warn about risk and explained how e-bikes are linked to theft and robberies.
- Officers have seized modified e-bikes.



Violence Against Women and Girls

We've been working to stop Violence Against Women and Girls by raising awareness in the community, talking to faith groups, and sharing crime prevention advice.

Examples of recent work:

- Crime prevention stalls held at various locations to encourage reporting, raise awareness, and connect victims with support services.
- Visits to addresses linked to exploitation and prostitution, carrying out safeguarding checks and offering tailored support to vulnerable women and girls.
- We have regular high-visibility patrols in parks and open spaces to deter offenders, reassure the community, and make public areas safer for women and girls.
- Community talk sessions where women tell officers where they feel unsafe, directly shaping patrol plans.

More trust Less crime High standards



We have been working closely with the Hillingdon Council Anti-Social Behaviour Team to address issues and improve living conditions across Hayes Town.

Examples of recent work:

- We have worked together to tackle the issues like street drinking and anti-social behaviour.
- We have conducted joint patrols in known hotspots to tackle nuisance behaviour.
- Issuing Community Protection warnings (CPW) and Community Protection Notices (CPN) to individuals causing ASB.
- Distributed materials which explains how to identify and report ASB.
