12:13:42 From Alan Reising : @ Jennifer - These products use 'Nano' block technology that provide an micro organic coating that disrupts the outer walls of a virus/bacteria which effective kills the organism. It does this without chemicals and is not classified as a 'disinfectant' by EPA or DPR. The coating is non-sacrificial and claims to continue to provide protection for up to 90 days.

12:15:15 From Alan Reising : @Eileen - We have not materially examined UV technology. The concern with UV is that it still requires continued re-application in order to be effective.

12:17:45 From Alan Reising : @ Jennifer - Steam may be problematic on classroom furniture, equipment, etc. It might be a solution for outdoor (robust) equipment, but I would be very concerned about damage to buildings. You may introduce mold causing moisture.
