### ASK BEFORE LESSON

1. What is a promise?
  1. How are promises made?
  2. Why are they important?
2. What is the promise God made to Abraham? (See Gen 12 & 15)
3. Why do you think this is important for us to know?
4. What is the difference between trusting in the law and trusting Christ?
5. Read Galatians 3:15-29. What does this teach you about God's promise to His children?

### ASK AFTER LESSON

1. What does Paul say the law cannot do to the promise God already made?
2. Why was the law given?
3. Which "job" of the law changes how you view the law? Why?
4. How does one become a child of God?
5. How does knowing we are justified by faith rather than the law change the way we approach God?
6. What does it mean to be clothed in Christ?
7. In light of verse 28, how should Christians treat each other?
8. How will you use the law's purpose this week?
9. How does being an heir of God's promise affect your identity and purpose?

### STANDING FIRM

We are looking at how the law cannot do what the promise can do, yet the law has a purpose. Pick one of the "jobs" of the law. Pick either the guardrail, the mirror, or the guide, and focus on how the law can still point you to Christ today.
