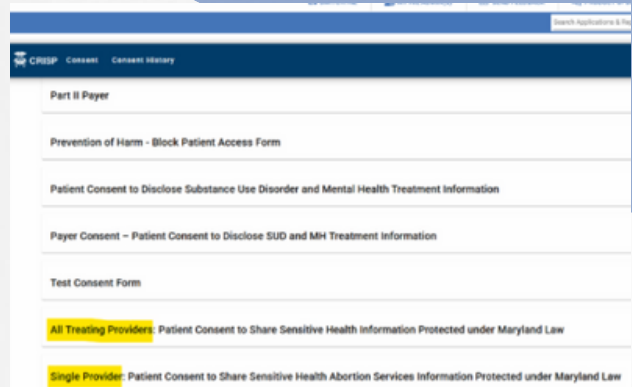

WHAT'S NEW WITH CRISP

CONSENT TOOL

CRISP has successfully launched a first-of-its-kind capability to protect reproductive health data in Maryland while ensuring it remains available to authorized providers with patient consent.

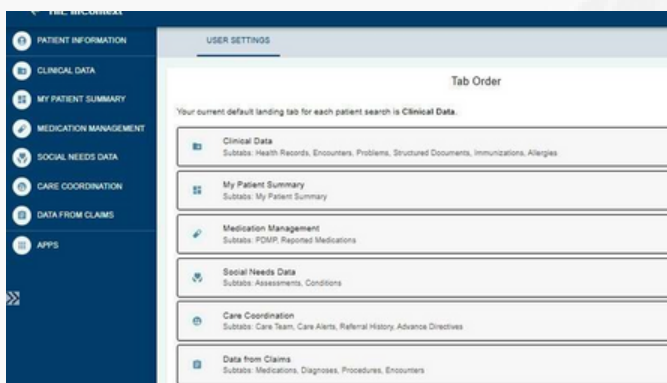
This work fulfills Maryland's groundbreaking legislation requiring sensitive health data, including abortion services information, to be filtered from records unless a patient authorizes sharing. Through our Consent Tool, patients can now choose to share this data with all their treating providers or a single provider—and can revoke consent anytime. MY PATIENT SUMMARY: INCONTEXT

As part of our continuous effort to better facilitate care, we introduced a new feature in April for InContext – My Patient Summary (MPS).

MPS is a customizable dashboard that allows users to build a unique tab within InContext, displaying only the data they select across patients. This new



feature, available through both the web-based portal and EHR application, focuses on streamlining the user experience. Users can pin up to 8 tabs of patient data available through InContext, eliminating repetitive time spent clicking through the tabs to find commonly needed data.

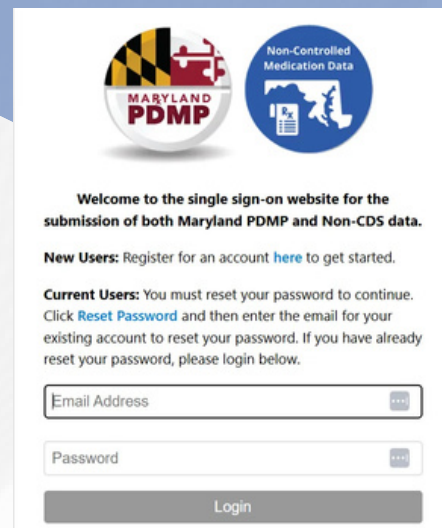

NON-CDS REPORTING

CRISP has partnered with Leap Orbit to collect non-controlled substance (non-CDS) dispense data, as outlined in state public health legislation.

Starting September 1st, pharmacies and dispensers are required to securely submit data through RxGov – no additional hardware or software is required. This initiative will help providers access a more complete medication history for their patients, improving safety and supporting informed prescribing decisions. Data is expected to populate in our system by the end of 2025. For details on reporting requirements and instructions for getting started, visit our [non-CDS webpage](#).

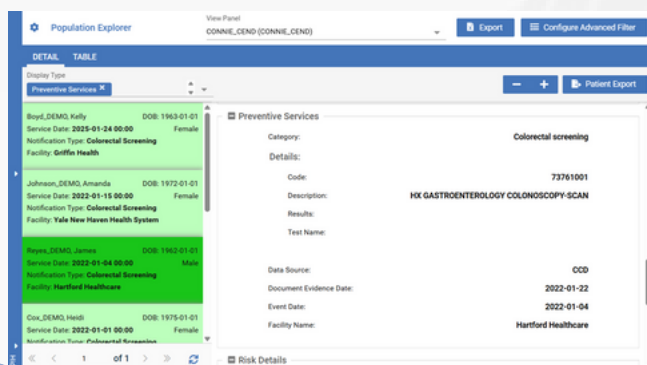

PREVENTIVE SERVICES: POPULATION EXPLORER

Starting this spring, we're thrilled to announce that Preventive Services data—including Colorectal and Breast Cancer Screening—are now available in Population Explorer.

The new Preventive Services Section shows notifications and guides you to source documents in the Clinical Information section of the HIE Portal/InContext. Notifications of preventive services now appear green and can be filtered, displaying details such as category, code, results, facility name, and more.
