Back by popular demand are the Junior Workshops. Friday's workshop will highlight all you need to know about Hoof Health & Care. They will conclude the night with a CJHA meeting and Dairy Bowl test. The Juniors will start Saturday with the Jeopardy Contest followed by session 1 of the Judging Workshop and College Presentations. This will be followed by lunch, the Speech Contest and session 2 of the Judging Workshop. The CJHA Awards Social will wrap up an eventful and fun-filled convention weekend. Junior Workshops:

Hoof Health & Care | Friday, Jan. 24th
Joanne Verstuyft from the hoof health research specialist Zinpro will teach how to keep your heifer or cow's feet in top shape. Anatomy, structure, and locomotion scoring help us to understand how maintenance and feeding are crucial to hoof care.

Dairy Judging | Saturday, Jan. 25th
Led by Cal Poly students and staff experienced in dairy evaluation and Dairy Judging Contests. Novice Session will cover the basics of the PDCA scorecard, cow parts, and placing a class. Advanced Session aims to improve judging skills. Build and refine a set of reasons to compete at the next level.
