ABOUT HAITI

The Republic of Haiti shares the island of Hispaniola with the Dominican Republic. It is the second largest island in the Caribbean.

- Life Expectancy, **62 years**
- Literacy Rate, **49%**

- Undernourished, **45%**
- School Enrollment, **50%**

FAST FACTS

- Haiti is the least-developed country in the Western Hemisphere and one of the poorest in the world. About 80% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- The World Food Program estimates that about 2.4 million Haitians cannot afford the recommended minimum daily calories.
- Currently, the majority of Haitians lack access to quality education; a prerequisite for sustained social and economic development. Despite improvements in enrollment and the commitment of the Haitian government to strengthening public education, much still needs to be done.

TRIP DETAILS:

Transportation: We will be flying from Orlando to Port-au-Prince, Haiti on JetBlue:

Jan 8 Flight #963 1:40 pm Orlando departure
Jan 14 Flight #964 5:21 pm Orlando return

Fee includes one checked bag under 50 lbs.

Accommodations: Groups are housed in the FFP Haiti house in Croix-des-bouquets which includes air conditioning. Housing is divided by gender with a common meeting/dining area. Accommodations are very basic with bunk beds, refreshing cool showers and fans.

Work Projects: While in Haiti, our group will participate in ongoing construction work at the Men Nan Men vocational school, Kwa Kok or some other village. It's not all about the concrete though: we'll also have the opportunity to teach English, worship with Haitian's, visit a local orphanage, conduct a VBS, distribute school supplies, hygiene kits or a LuminAID pack-light/phone charger kit to a needy remote village.

Evenings/Free Day: Evenings offer us time to relax and share a meal together. After dinner, which is provided for us, we will reflect on our experiences and prepare for the following day. Time permitting we may spend a day at the beach or some other tourist activity.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

This trip is open to St. Andrew, Tampa Bay Presbytery Churches, and friends ages 18 and up.

To register: return the following items to the church office no later than October 6, 2019:

- 1) Non-refundable tax deductible \$560 deposit payable to St. Andrew Presbyterian Church
- 2) Copy of both sides of participant's medical insurance card.

Additional Items:

- All participants must have a passport valid through at least July 14, 2020.
- Immunizations, especially tetanus, must be current. A course of malaria prophylaxis with chloroquine, started one week prior to departure, is highly recommended. Hepatitis A & B and oral Typhoid Fever vaccines are also recommended.
