

Pamela Casey, a native of Blount County, Alabama, earned her bachelor's degree in political science with honors from Rhodes College in 2003 and a Juris Doctor, cum laude, from Seattle University School of Law in 2006.

Devoting her life to public service, Pamela began her career in the Alabama Attorney general's Office where she was hired as an Assistant Attorney General and earned a promotion to Deputy Attorney General. She served in the capital litigation and violent crimes divisions. During that time, she successfully prosecuted cases in state trial and appellate courts and in federal court.

In 2011, at the age of 29, Pamela became the youngest female elected District Attorney by defeating three opponents, including the incumbent and a former district attorney.

Pamela was re-elected in 2016 and 2022.

Pamela holds a National Board Certification in Criminal Law by the National Board of Trial Advocacy. Currently, she is only one of two attorneys in the State to hold such honor. She has been an Alabama State Bar Criminal Law Specialist since 2015.

Pamela has dedicated her career to advocating for victims. In 2015, she received the Prosecutor of the Year award from VOCAL and the Voices for Victims Award from Shelby County VOCAL. She has also served as state chairwoman and board member of VOCAL.

Pamela is married to Robert, who is a high school science teacher. They have two children, Glen and Claire. They are members of Church of the Highlands.

Pamela has a proven record inside and outside of the courtroom. As our Attorney General, she will keep Alabama safe by standing with law enforcement to fight drug and human trafficking, defend our families from cyber criminals and online predators who target children, protect our communities from illegal immigrants, and stand tall and fight for our conservative principles.
