



Greening Your Holidays

Suggestions & ideas from Memorial's Creation Care Work Group for a "Greener" Holiday Season!



Decorations:

- If you don't already own a tree, buy a real one. Tree farms prevent land development, trees remove carbon from the atmosphere while they are growing, and when we're done using them most communities pick them up and turn them into mulch (or you can donate your tree to Catty Shack)
- When you replace lights, purchase LED ones, instead. Use timers so lights aren't on during the daytime and while you are sleeping
- Decorate only with what you already own or can find in nature. Make beautiful table arrangements with foliage cuttings, citrus, and candles. Resist the urge to buy more decorations at the seasonal sales.
- Speaking of candles, they can be polluters. For scenting your home, make a potpourri or heat up a batch of mulled cider. If you do use candles, go for the clean burning, 100% beeswax varieties.

Gifts:

- When holiday gift shopping, bring your own reusable bags. They're not just for the grocery store.
- For host/hostess gifts, consider local products such as honey or craft
- Give fewer, but more meaningful gifts (consider homemade items). Visit local shops and seek out sustainably made items. Also, plants make wonderful, green gifts.
- Look for recycled content holiday cards, or send e-cards.
- Use recycled content wrapping paper, butcher paper, or reusable cloth or paper gifts bags. Reuse tissue bows and ribbons that are still in good condition. Have a paper bag or box ready for collecting recyclable wrappings on Christmas morning.

Meals:

- Serve in-season, locally sourced food (and don't forget those reusable bags when you go shopping). Cook from scratch. Chose organic, if possible.
- Try to save energy while cooking by cooking items together. Use slow cookers and pressure cookers, and convection settings for oven use. On the stove, use the properly sized burner for the pot or pan, and conserve energy by using lids.
- Store leftovers in glass containers or reusable bags and wraps.
- If you eat a turkey, pick it clean and boil the bones to make broth. Freeze broth in ice cube trays so small portions are readily available.
- A full dishwasher uses less water and energy than handwashing, so after the feast, scrape your plates (rather than wasting water rinsing), and promptly load and run your washer (with environmentally friendly soap).
- For entertaining, use real dishes, glasses, and cloth napkins (but wash them in earth-friendly soap). Recycle cans and bottles. Or even better, filter water and make a punch instead of using bottles and cans for beverages.
- Compost fruit and vegetable scraps (if you don't compost at home, you can bring it to the community garden at St. Peter's).


