

### 2022 Legislative Session Weekly Report Chamber of Commerce

**February 18, 2022** 

#### Week Six

Tuesday marked a major deadline for the 2022 legislative session. All bills needed to pass out of their chamber of origin to stay alive. The last bill must begin debate by 5:00 PM on cutoff day in order to be considered. Leading up to the deadline the legislature debated many controversial proposals for several hours taking up significant floor time, leaving several bills to die on the House and Senate floor calendars. However, any bill that is deemed necessary to implement the budget is not subject to cutoffs.

Notable pieces of legislation that made it through before the cutoff include HB 1837, which is legislation that would restore the state's ability to address work-related musculoskeletal injuries. This piece of legislation is particularly controversial as it would seek to overturn a longstanding prohibition on L&I rulemaking authority on this topic as a result of an initiative. I-841 was passed by voters in 2003 and repealed the ergonomics rule and prevented new rulemaking unless a federal standard is adopted. The floor debate took 9 hours total, the house debated 18 amendments and final adoption through the night. Ultimately the vote passed by a very slim margin 50-48 and will now move to the Senate for further consideration.

Priority pieces of legislation that failed to make it through the cutoff include Governor request legislation, <u>HB 1782</u>, related to middle housing. The bill requires local jurisdictions to allow for more dense housing options in areas that have been traditionally zoned for single-family housing. The bill has been controversial as it moved through the legislative process. Low-income housing advocates support the legislation while local jurisdictions and local level homeowners have concerns. This year, there was more broad support for the bill as environmentalists, realtors, and other groups weighed in with support. However, ultimately the bill did not move forward.

Last week, the Democrats released their <u>transportation plan</u> called "Move Ahead Washington." On Tuesday, the Senate brought the revenue portion of the package, <u>SB 5974</u>, to the floor for a vote which passed 29-20. On Wednesday, House Transportation leadership Representatives Fey and Barkis joined The Impact for an in depth interview and look at the \$16.8 billion dollar proposal. On Wednesday, the Senate released their <u>Capital Budget Proposal</u> and the largest spending areas are as follows; \$472 for housing, \$120 million for broadband, \$327 for water, and \$115 million for school seismic safety. To see a more detailed report, <u>click here</u>. It is anticipated that the House will release their version on Monday.

Wednesday, the state Economic & Revenue Forecast Council released the February Revenue Forecast which projected a \$2.774 billion increase in revenue. This amount combined with the prior increases experienced since lawmakers adopted the 2021-23 budget, revenues have now exceeded expectations by \$10.5 billion. The House and Senate are expected to release the rest of their budget proposals on Monday, with hearings to follow. Negotiations between the House and Senate will begin and the final budget must pass the legislature by March 10th.

In a press release on Thursday, Governor Jay Inslee provided next steps in the changing COVID protocols relating to mask mandates. With dropping hospitalization rates, beginning March 21st Washingtonians will no longer be required

to wear masks in most places. You can read the full update here.

Some notable videos of interest this week include the Virtual Town Hall on Climate where Governor Inslee joined former Vice President Al Gore and current White House National Climate Advisor Gina McCarthy; click here to watch. Republican leadership availability was hosted by House Leader J.T. Wilcox and Rep. Eric Robertson and Senate Minority Leader John Braun and Senate Whip Keith Waggoner. During this discussion, the republicans discussed cutoffs, their perspective on how session is going so far, and their priorities for the remainder of session. During the Democratic leadership availability, Majority Leader Senator Andy Billig and Deputy Majority Leader Rebecca Saldana joined from the Senate and House Speaker Laurie Jinkins and Majority Leader Pat Sullivan joined from the House. Democrats were given the opportunity to provide insight on many different issues they are facing right now.

Following the House of Origin cutoff legislators will go back to committee hearings and executive sessions until the Opposite House Fiscal Cut Off on February 24th.

#### **Economic Development and Community Investment**

#### <u>HB 1015</u> - Creating the Washington Equitable Access to Credit Act

This legislation would create the Washington Equitable Access to Credit Program that would be housed at the Department of Commerce. The program would be funded by a B&O tax credit for contributions to the program. Commerce would then award grants to community development financial institutions for lending or investing in historically underserved communities. The bill was heard on Thursday, February 17th at 8:00am in the Senate Business, Financial Institutions and Trade Committee. The bill needs to be voted out of committee by February 24th in order to stay alive.

#### **Housing Affordability and Homelessness**

# <u>HB 1782/SB 5670</u> - Creating additional middle housing near transit and in areas traditionally dedicated to single-family detached housing

This is Governor request legislation that seeks to restore affordable housing by requiring cities to authorize the development of all middle housing types on all lots zoned for detached single-family residential use and within one-half mile of a major transit stop. Unfortunately HB 1782 did not make it out of the House before the cut off and it is unlikely that this legislation will be moving forward this year.

#### **HB 1981** - Concerning local government planning

This legislation introduced by Rep. Gerry Pollet (D-46) seeks to improve the availability of middle housing by allocating \$25 million from the General Fund to the Department of Commerce to provide grants to cities and counties for this purpose. The bill did not advance out of the House before the cut off but could be considered NTIB.

# <u>HB 1866</u> - Assisting persons receiving community support services through medical assistance programs to receive supportive housing

Legislation brought forward by Rep. Chopp treats chronic homelessness as a medical condition and proposes a healthcare solution. The bill creates the Apple Health and Homes Program to provide a supportive housing benefit for individuals that are enrolled in medical assistance. The bill passed the house 96-2 and is scheduled to be heard on Monday, February 21st in the Senate Health and Long Term Care Committee.

#### **HB 1660** - Concerning accessory dwelling units

This legislation sponsored by Rep. Shewmake requires cities and counties to allow for the construction of accessory dwelling units within urban growth areas. The bill passed the house 50-48 and is scheduled to be heard next week on February 23rd in the Senate Committee on Housing & Local Government.

#### Employment Law

<u>SB 5873/SB 2031</u> - Concerning unemployment insurance, family leave, and medical leave premiums. Legislation sponsored by Senator Keiser (D-33) in the Senate and Rep. April Berg (D-40) in the House proposes

changes to the state's UI program. As a result of the PFML solvency issue the PFML provisions in the bill have been removed from the bill. The remaining UI provisions in the bill would decrease the maximum social tax (social cost factor) for 2022 and 2023. The bill was heard and passed out of the House Labor and Workplace Standards Committee this week.

#### SB 5649 - Modifying the Washington state paid family and medical leave act

This legislation sponsored by Senator June Robinson (D-38) proposes a number of changes to the state's PFML program. As a result of the recent solvency issues there was an amendment in the Senate that includes a JLARC audit, an OFM outside contract to hire a financial consulting firm to help with fund analysis and solvency projections, a legislative taskforce to develop recommendations for 2023 legislative session changes and several other accountability measures. The bill passed the Senate 42-7 and was heard on Friday, February 18th in the House Labor and Workplace Standards Committee. The bill is scheduled for executive session on Tuesday, February 22nd.

# <u>HB 2076</u> - Concerning rights and obligations of transportation network company drivers and transportation network companies

Legislation introduced by Rep. Berry (D-36) which reflects years of conversations between the labor community and transportation network companies. The bill remains on the House floor calendar however it is not subject to cutoffs. It is our understanding that stakeholders continue to work towards an agreement .
