Durham Labour Force Report August 2020

Oshawa - The Durham Workforce Authority is releasing the August 2020 edition of the Durham Labour Force Report. This report provides accurate, timely, and easy to understand labour market information for the stakeholders of Durham Region. It is updated monthly with information that enables businesses, policy makers and our community at large to better understand the evolving impact that the COVID-19 pandemic is having on the labour force in Durham Region.

The August 2020 report revealed some positive numbers, including;

- a decrease of 3,800 individuals not participating in the labour force,
- an increase of 4,200 individuals in the total labour force,
- an increase of 5,500 employed residents.

The Labour Force Report is informed by data from Statistics Canada on the Oshawa CMA, which includes Clarington, Whitby, and Oshawa. A fact sheet providing more information on the Oshawa CMA and why it is used as a data proxy for Durham Region is also being provided with this month's report.
