Pentecost

“And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit...” Acts 2:2 – 4a

Lesson: This week we learned that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to comfort and help His disciples...and us... after He had returned to Heaven (the Greek word, *paraclete*, which is used to refer to the Holy Spirit in the Gospel of John 14:16-17, actually means “comforter, counselor or one who is called to the side of another”). Having the Holy Spirit means that God dwells within us, giving us peace in troubled times and helping us share God’s love with others.
