Dear Church Family,

As the days seem to fluctuate from warm to cold, unsure of which season we are in, we approach the beginning of our Lenten season in the church year. Lent is a time when we are invited to journey deeper in our faith, reflecting on our lives and how we can grow in our faithfulness and love with God and our neighbor. This year, our Lenten worship series will draw our focus to the sacrament of Holy Communion, helping us all to better understand and experience the theological and practical implications of partaking in this gift of grace. Too often we simply “go through the motions” of this sacred meal, repeating the words of the liturgy without thinking deeply about what we are saying, and what we are called to do in response. As our worship services focus on the different dimensions of the sacrament, we will be invited to participate and receive in a variety of ways each week – sometimes kneeling, sometimes standing. We will even break out the stackable trays with the individual cups for the juice. It is our hope and prayer that this exploration into This Holy Mystery will deepen your faith and experience of God’s grace through this sacred meal.

Our Lenten season begins this year with our Ash Wednesday services on March 6th. Please join us, either at the noontime service, which is followed by soup lunch, or for our evening service at 7 PM. Beginning on this day of repentance, we enter into a season of contemplation and inward searching, preparing our hearts and lives for the heart-wrenching journey of Holy Week.

I invite you to hold the following prayer with you throughout the Lenten season:

Dear Lord, You have shown me how Love warms without burning, cools without chilling, holds without crushing. Whenever I may be hungry, Love can fill my emptiness. Whenever I may be wounded, Love can heal. However down I may feel, one touch of its joy can lift my spirits. There are times, though, when Love expects more of me than I have to give. If it is possible, let that cup pass from me, but if not... Amen.

May we all emerge from this Lenten journey on a closer walk with God, centered in the love of Christ, and fueled by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen!




UMW General Meeting – March 2nd, 10 – 12noon in Fellowship Hall: This meeting is open to the congregation.
